#### REFLECTION

In this weekend's Gospel, the fates of the two individuals after death are very much tied to their experiences in this life. The story centers on the reversal of fortunes that takes place after Lazarus and the rich man die. Jesus quickly tells us important details of the rich man. He gives us the details: this man was clothed in purple and fine linen. His clothing was the best money could buy. When it came to himself, he spared no expense. The rich loved to be clothed in purple; it was the color of royalty. The clothing was dyed using a very costly purple dye and seen as a luxury only for the very rich.

Jesus also makes us aware, that this poor man was in very close vicinity to the rich man. While in this life, the rich man had ample time to tend to the needs of

Lazarus but never gave him a second thought. Lazarus, was covered with sores, whereas the rich man was clothed in purple and fine linen. Surely, the Pharisees would have viewed Lazarus as unclean and suffering Divine judgment. Once he died, Lazarus no longer suffered. He no longer was hungry, needy and he now had a home; rather than being mocked as he lay at the rich man's gate.

Followers of Christ will not be indifferent to the plight of the poor like the rich man in this story. God loves the poor and is hurt when we neglect them. In fact, those who show mercy to the poor are in effect ministering Christ's work.

The readings for the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C call us to care about others.

In the first reading we are warned against being complacent while others suffer.

The psalm praises the justice of God. In the second reading Paul reminds us to pursue virtues.

In the gospel Jesus tells the parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus, where a wealthy man ignored the needs of a poor man every day.
