Light surrounds us even if shadow abounds. God is the God of Joy and we should rejoice as people do when the harvest is brought in.

These hopeful and encouraging words of Isaiah are part of the passage quoted by Matthew when he begins the story of Jesus' ministry. We live in a time when the signs of harvest with its residue of empty paddocks and stripped vines are echoed by the destruction of a deadly harvest caused by the natural disaster we have experienced. Every ending prefigures a new beginning. Our humanity is most engaged by the suffering of our brothers and sisters. This is a universal call which we have sometimes allowed ourselves to ignore. Into such a situation in his own time Jesus moves, as he begins his ministry.


Gospel of Matthew Retreat Fr Frank Moloney SDB 3 – 6 February
