The privilege of partaking in the Breaking of Bread

In this week's Gospel we are reminded of the story of Jesus meeting up with two of his disciples on the road to Emmaus and how his journey with them is similar to the structure of the mass that we celebrate.

The story begins with the two men setting off on a journey of their own making. At the beginning of Mass, we too commence our journey by confessing that we have gone off course.

Whilst on the road to Emmaus, the disciples have lots of questions about what Jesus' life and death means and the traveller helps the men understand what had happened by showing them God's plan revealed in the Hebrew Scriptures. In the Liturgy of the Word, we too hear Scriptures expounded, revealing more fully the true identity of Jesus of Nazareth.

When they drew near to the village to which they were going, the traveller makes as if he is going on with his journey; but the disciples press him to stay with them. The traveller then takes bread, blesses it, and gives it to them to eat. In that moment of breadsharing, the two men recognised their travelling companion as the Risen Lord. Eat the bread consecrated at Mass, and we receive into our very being the Divine Companion for our journey through life.

In this time of social isolation where we do not have the opportunity to share in this breaking of the bread, let us pause for a moment to thank God for the privilege that we have had to do so at every Mass. And let us not take this for granted when the opportunity for us next arises.
