Divine Mercy Sunday Celebrating God's Merciful Love

In the Jubilee Year 2000, Pope John Paul II declared the 2nd Sunday of Easter would be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday.

This was proclaimed at the Canonisation Mass of St.
Faustina Kawalska, (1905 – 1938) who worked throughout
her life to make all aware of the merciful love of God.
St. Faustina was born and raised in Poland and was
accepted into the congregation by the Sisters of Our Lady of
Mercy. Her contemplation on the Mercy of God led her to
develop a trust in God and deep love for her neighbor.

The Divine Mercy image depicts Jesus at the moment he appears to the disciples in the Upper Room, after the Resurrection, when he empowers them to forgive or retain sins. - John 20:19-31, which is the Gospel reading for this Sunday in all 3 yearly Sunday liturgical cycles (A, B & C) How did Jesus empower the apostles to forgive or retain sins?

[21] Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you."

[22] And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit.

[23] If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

He thus gave them a special empowerment with the Holy Spirit to forgive or retain sins.

When celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday, we are called to reflect more personally on the graces won through the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. In this way our hearts may be more fully aware of the mercy of God for us personally and for the sake of the world.

# Plenary 2020 Update: 222,000 have contributed to national dialogue

The Listening and Dialogue phase of preparation for the Plenary Council 2020 is now complete and over 220,000 people contributed to the process.

The National Centre for Pastoral Research is conducting a qualitative and quantitative analysis of the submissions received and, using best-practice research methods, are undertaking the important task of identifying the key themes that have emerged. The timeline for the process can be accessed via the Plenary Council website and it is envisaged that by the end of May the national themes for discernment will be finalised. These themes will then become the focus of the Listening and Discernment phase which will commence in June (Pentecost). Further detail about how this next phase will unfold will be available toward the end of May.
