PRAYER OF SOLIDARITY FOR THE PEOPLE OF AFGHANISTAN

Only through dialogue can the battered population of that country — men, women, elderly and children — return to their own homes, and live in peace and security, in total mutual respect.

Fr Joseph's Homily

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B, 2021

Almost everybody believes that God not only created us but also continues to give us life and breath. These people also believe that God gives us our special talents – our intelligence, our ability to play musical instruments and sports. But some people would stop there. They might say, "Yes, my brains come from God, but the development of my brains comes from my own hard work and study." Or, they might say, "God gave me my basic abilities, but because of my constant practice, I have achieved excellence in my chose field." Of course, it is true that one must study hard, or practice hard, if one's basic talents are to be developed. But where does this basic drive and desire to practice hard or to study well come from? This strong desire to use one's talent comes from God, as well as the intellectual talent itself. God not only starts us on the journey towards excellence but he gives us the strong desire to be excellence and he accompanies us every step along the way to excellence. This is what James meant in this Sunday's Second Reading (James 1:17-18) when he said, "Every worthwhile gift, every genuine benefit comes from above." The start comes from the Lord. The continuation is a joint effort. And nothing could be brought to its completion without the workings of the Lord.
