GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY. John 10:1-10



John's gospel names Jesus as the Good Shepherd. This image of Jesus is drawn from the parable told by Jesus about the shepherd who leaves his ninety-nine sheep to look for his lost sheep and is recorded in both Matthew and Luke.

Jesus, through his own life and the use of parables in his teaching, revealed the great love and compassion of his Father.

The early Christian community's personal knowledge of Jesus or through hearing of Jesus from his followers, used this name, Good Shepherd, for Jesus. For them, this image encapsulated Jesus's great care of, and love for human beings, and one who had given His life for all humanity.

They began to realize the inclusive and unconditional nature of God's love. They came to understand that, "We are all God's children" (Acts 17:28) and that "God has no favourites" (Acts 10:34 and Rm 2:11.) James in his letter reminds the community, "Do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people" (Jm 2:1-4).

For a shepherd to go off to find one lost sheep, seems ludicrous when he had ninety- nine more. However, it certainly highlights this compassionate love of our God who loves deeply, each and every one of us. Our human nature sets up distinctions between us. We make comparisons. May we ask God for healing when we notice these distinctions appearing in ourselves. God will gently lead us to open ourselves to His unconditional love of us as we are.

FATHER JOSEPH HOMILY

4th Sunday of Easter, Year A, 2020

There are former athletes who have a trophy room where all their awards are kept behind glass cabinets. They often go there to relive their triumphs.

There are also people who treasure their past hurts in their mind. It is likely they too have a room in their mind where they keep their past hurts and resentments and

where they visit and relive each hurting word or harsh deed that they have experienced in the past. They keep repeating to themselves the hurting words which they received years ago, just like the former athlete keeps repeating the time when he or she won the footy or netball championship in the final three seconds of the game. The athlete does this because he/she always leaves his or her trophy room lifted up on a positive note, while the hurt party always leaves his or her trophy room of hurts in a sad or resentful mood. This is not the kind of life that Jesus wanted us to live. Jesus died for us so that we would be free from anger and resentment. If we still harbor hatred, then the death of Jesus, in our case,

was in vain.

Wallowing in past injuries is certainly not living life to the full. Let us forgive.

Let us pray and ask our gentle Good Shepherd Jesus to heal our hearts.

Let not the death of Jesus have been in vain for us.
