In the words of Jesus

I have recently come across this great reflection on this week's gospel by Greg Sunter, an academic and member of the Religious Education team and Mission and Formation team in Catholic Education Brisbane. He articulates the historical context of the Holy Trinity and I thought it was a really good read. Here is his article.

"The Church this week celebrates the central doctrine of Christian faith: the Trinity. The belief in the Trinity is the belief that there are three 'persons' in the one Godhead:

Father; Son; and Holy Spirit. The understanding and articulation of this doctrine occurred over time and was not until well after the writing of the gospels and other New Testament letters. Consequently, there are no specific

scriptural passages that identify explicitly the doctrine of the Trinity. This week's gospel passage, the commissioning of the disciples from the Gospel of Matthew is perhaps the closest any New Testament writer comes to an expression of the Trinity when Jesus instructs the disciples to baptise 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'.

The word 'Trinity' does not appear anywhere in the New Testament although one can certainly see the beginnings of ideas about a Trinitarian God. It was not until 325, at the

Council of Nicea, that the doctrine of the trinity was established as being orthodox teaching. This council sought to officially define the relationship between the Father and the Son. The statement of beliefs developed by this council in 325 is the Creed (credo = I believe) that is used in Catholic churches around the world today.

Jesus' instruction that the disciples go out to all the nations and baptise them 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit' is an instruction that is still being carried on today. Those precise words are used by the priest at every baptism. They are also the words used in the sign of the cross – whether that is a personal, private blessing of oneself or a blessing of a group as in the introductory and dismissal rites as part of a Eucharistic celebration. When we make the sign of the cross we use the words of Jesus."

Covid 19 – Update for parishioners.

Dear Parishioners,

As you are aware the Victorian Government, the Victorian Public Health Office have implemented a 'circuit-breaker lockdown' **as of 11.59pm on 27th May 2021** for 7 days. The Archdiocese has also provided information that confirms no Masses will be permitted during this lockdown.

We are hoping that we will re-open again on the weekend of 5th & 6th June with the new mandatory inclusion of the Services Victoria QR Code that will come into effect from 28th May 2021. This is the only QR code that should be used when entering our Church and we ask that you ensure you bring your mobile phone with you. If you or your phone do not have the capacity to download this app or sign in to this code, we will have people at each Mass who will be able to either step you through this or sign you in using an IPad.

We have included the new QR Code in the Newsletter, so if you could sign in prior to coming to the Church, ie in your home or in the car, you will save time and avoid blockages in the Church Foyer.

Hand sanitizing is still an essential part of our Covid Safe Plan and by following all of the advice above, this will keep you and our parish community safe and is critical in allowing our Church to re-open.

Funerals: Only 10 people will be allowed including the priest and funeral

directors.

Weddings: No weddings permitted during this 7 day lockdown period.

Baptism: No baptisms during this 7 day lockdown period.

We acknowledge that this again is a challenging time for you all.

The Parish Leadership Team thanks you for your patience and understanding. We are all in this together and if we all do the right thing, we can and will get through this again.
