In today's gospel (Mark 21: 28-34)



A REFLECTION _31st Sunday of YEAR B_ 31 October 2021



Jesus said, "This is the first of the commandments ~ Listen ...the Lord our God is the one Lord & you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind & with all your strength. & the second is this: you must love your neighbour as yourself." The scribe who had asked Jesus the guestion responded, "What you say is so right, Master!" Then Jesus looked on him with love, saying, "You are not far from the kingdom of God."

Our coming out of lockdown can resonate with today's reading, as we move to the end of Scripture Cycle B. Jesus is now in Jerusalem, opposite the Temple, as he moves towards the climax of his teaching & healing Journey from Galilee. An earnest Scribe gives Mark the opportunity to remind the hearers - us - what lies at the heart of Jesus' mission & ministry, which is increasingly a clash between so-generous, driving love & entrenched self-seeking power, leading inevitably to Calvary. Over the Journey, Jesus is recorded healing the daughter of a Syrian-Phoenician woman; restoring hearing to one man, sight to another; feeding a great number of followers, hungry for bread as well as the Word. His glory is proclaimed on the high mountain, & his coming ordeal foretold but not yet believed by his disciples, who argue who is the greatest; in response, a little child is presented, "Anyone who welcomes ones of these little children in my name, welcomes me ...(&) the one who sent me"; a stark reminder to our world which so readily dismisses, disfigure & trashes children; children are the honest simple example of true discipleship. There is then a meeting with a rich young man, who knows the law of love in head but not heart, who departs in wealthy sorrow when invited to "Sell all Follow me": a counterpoint to the Scribe. Then, the encounter with Bartimaeus, the beggar, giving away all he has - a cloak! - to follow Jesus; this is at Jericho, last stop on the Journey. These Journey chapters are the stuff of our mission & ministry, focused on the Twin Commandment of Love. And a question, in a time of insistent calls to mindfulness, wellness, positivity, & self-care - "How often do we dismiss or disregard the Gospel command to truly love self?" This love is not selfishness, arrogance or pride, but a humble measure of our love for God & neighbour. Coming to deeply & honestly know self; heal & forgive self; correct, strengthen & encourage self is at the very heart of loving one another.

As the Fourth Gospel charges us, "By this shall all people know that you are my disciples, that you have love for one another" (John 13.35).

Peace, Safety Love as we open up to a wider world, to each other - especially - our very own precious selves!
