Reflection

The Prodigal Son is a story about the state of the heart. At times our hearts are orientated towards wanting a good life—and seeking it without considering the cost. Over time, disappointment can lead to our hearts being hardened and bruised, and it can feel like a risk to return 'home', knowing the great hurt that has been done. Our hearts may anxiously seek forgiveness, unsure of whether it will be offered to us. At times our hearts are full of love and we are able to forgive easily—even in the face of disappointment and embarrassment. The heart of the elder son is one many of us know well: this is the heart that smarts when we feel we have been unjustly treated or overlooked. And the other heart—well, for those who believe—is the heart of God: the heart that is always ready to welcome us home; the heart of goodness, justice and mercy; the heart that constantly invites us to taste and see the goodness of the Lord.
