FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT 26th March 2023 Issue No. 8

REFLECTION

Following today's Gospel the Pharisees plan the demise of Jesus, but they are only one example of a response to the miraculous raising of Lazarus. There are at least five responses in the Gospel, starting with Jesus for whom this is an experience of relationship with the Father who glorifies the Son and leads others to belief. For Martha and Mary it is an experience of the love of Jesus in their love for Lazarus who is restored to life. For the onlookers it is an event which lead them to believe in Jesus. For the Pharisees blinded by the self-concern which we saw last Sunday, this miracle challenges their identify, and they now plot the death of Jesus. The unstated but perhaps more important response belongs to Lazarus. What is his experience? It is much more than simply coming back to life. Before being raised, Lazarus had experienced life in the same way as we have experienced life. He took life for granted, it was a given. After experiencing death, his experience of life is different. Being alive is now a conscious reality through which Lazarus knows love. Life is a gift which unites us to God and each other through love.

Dear parishioners, Pope Francis has asked the Archdiocese and parishes to look at how and

when we can achieve his desire to bring people back to the church and love Jesus again. Parish priests will be participating in a number of learning seminars/workshops over the coming months to inform parish leaders and staff on how we can translate this into our broader parish and local communities. In the meantime, we as parishioners are being invited to ask family and friends to join us in our faith journey.

We are currently exploring what activities we can introduce to be more welcoming, hospitable and inclusive, especially to new parishioners. This can be a number of ways, morning teas, light lunches, light supper etc. Father Joseph and Parish Leaders will also attend the Eastern Regional Consultation session in April/May (date TBC). These sessions are to help inform and shape Take the Way of the Gospel.
