REFLECTION

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is often referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday, as all Readings have a central theme of a shepherd and or protector. This weekend our Gospel reading explores the theme of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. This passage builds on the idea that Jesus is the Good Shepherd and we his followers are those he protects. The relationship between the sheep and their shepherd is based on familiarity. Sheep recognise their shepherd and will not follow a stranger. The primary focus of the shepherd is to lead their sheep from pastures to a common gated area. This one shepherd protects all the sheep, they move among the sheep and the sheep follow only their shepherd.

Central to this theme is the idea that the Church is a community of believers who are led and guided by Christ. The metaphor of the sheep and shepherd is meant to evoke a sense of care and protection, as well as a shared sense of purpose and belonging among the members of the Church. This theme is closely tied to the idea of Jesus as the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. It emphasises the idea that believers can trust in Jesus to protect and care for them, even in the face of danger or hardship. This theme highlights the sense of security and peace that comes from trusting in Jesus as one's shepherd and protector.
