Ponder and Reflect on our Faith Journey

For the second Sunday of Lent, we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert to his Transfiguration.

The Transfiguration is told in 3 Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke.

In each, the Transfiguration follows Jesus' first prediction of his death and his teaching about the costs of discipleship.

Jesus' Transfiguration is a promise of Jesus' glory, his Resurrection.

The Transfiguration occurs in the presence of just 3 of Jesus' disciples: Peter, James, and John.

In Matthew's Gospel, those disciples are among the first whom Jesus calls. They also encounter God.

They experience the divine presence in the transformed Jesus Christ. The change in his face, which "shown like the sun" and his clothes which became "white as light" are a reference back to Moses appearance after receiving the Ten Commandments.

The Transfiguration also foreshadows the resurrection of Jesus.

In his appearance to Mary of Magdala at the tomb,
He also had bright white clothes.
And clearly something was significantly
different about his appearance, for
Mary did not recognize him.

Do we recognize Jesus when we encounter him? Are we open to being transformed?

Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you

Whether it is a simple act of kindness or a bold or courageous gesture, something happens that brings the person's true character into relief, and the enlightenment leads to love.



We cannot command enlightment any more than we can force ourselves to fall in love. But we can be attentive as we walk with others. This week through Project Compassion, we learn about Tereesa, a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children as a single mother.

Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Tereesa was also able to hear stories from Indigenous Elders and reconnect with her culture.

Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community. Tereesa now works at Baabayn, supporting young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.
