HE WHO HESITATES

In today's gospel (Luke 10:25-37) we read about the man who was robbed, beaten, and left half dead at the side of a lonely road.

The first person to see him was a Jewish priest.

Was the priest moved to help the half dead man?

I suppose he was moved to help, but he didn't stop and help.

He didn't act on his first good impulse. We are sometimes like this. We have the impulse to do a good deed, us we let the moment pass us by. If we were asked why we didn't act, sometimes we couldn't even give a reason.

The second person who passed by was a professional. Was he initially moved to stop and help? I suppose he too was moved, but something paralysed him and stopped him from acting. Sometimes we are like that; we have good intentions, good impulses, but they do not issue forth into action, and a chance is lost forever. A story is told of a person crossing a river in a big row boat. His bag with all his valuables fell into the water and began to sink. He was moved to dive into the water while he could still see the bag, but held back and marked the side of the boat with his penknife in the exact place where the bag had fallen from the boat. When the boat reached the shore, the side of the boat was still marked, but he had no way of finding his treasure.

He lost his chance, the way the first and second passersby lost their chances of helping the half dead man in todays gospel.

He who hesitates when God calls him to act is lost!

Time marches on. Opportunities for grace march on.

We cannot return to a neglected moment of grace.

We can only pray that we do not neglect another moment of grace if it is offered to us.

When God calls - act. Some opportunities come to us but once.

Monthly Church Collection

Dear Parishioners,

Parish finances are pretty much the same as home finances, income versus expenses and hopefully a little left over for the wish

For the parish, the income is from US, the parish community. The Archdiocese does not contribute to parishes, in fact the parishes are contributors to the Archdiocese by way of a quarterly levy.

Our current situation is that the income being received is becoming close to not being adequate to cover the increasing costs of services, maintenance & parish staff.

This has been especially impacted by the restrictions, lockdowns and regulations caused by the global Covid Pandemic.

Unfortunately this has led to the parish having to introduce a monthly Church collection commencing the weekend of 9th and 10th July 2022 and every four weeks thereafter, to assist with meeting running costs and maintaining our ageing buildings and property.

We understand that this is a difficult time for everyone and we do not make this request lightly, but out of necessity and sincerely appreciate that our parish community has been very generous in previous collections.

The parish leadership team will continue to inform parishioners of the many maintenance and upgrades projects currently being undertaken and planned over the next 12 months to ensure that our buildings and surrounding property is

safe, secure and viable into the future.
