REFLECTION

God speaks to us in many ways, including through the Scripture readings. On the second Sunday of Lent, we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert and temptation by the devil to the glory shown in Jesus' Transfiguration.

Jesus has just announced to Peter, John and James what awaits him: his death and resurrection.

At the same time, a voice confirms Jesus in his mission with the command, *"Listen to him!"* To listen is to be attentive to someone's words. It is to act according to what is asked of us. It is to pay attention, not only with our heads, but also with our hearts.

Will we be able to recognise the voice of the Father saying, "*This is my Son... listen to him!*" To listen to the beloved Son is to accept to open our hearts to His invitations. We hear this story of Jesus' Transfiguration early in Lent, but we have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection even as we prepare to remember Jesus' Passion and death. How can we open our hearts more to truly hear the Word in others?


