Masses

We will require our parishioners to be flexible to ensure that we do not breach the guidelines for outdoor religious worshipping.

Masses will be held at the Undercroft at SPJE School with access via the school carpark in Reay Road. You can enter the carpark and veer left towards the basketball courts. There will be a person there to direct you to car spaces. Strictly no parking is allowed on any of the soft court surfaces.

A COVID Safe Plan will be displayed at all Masses and attendees are required to adhere to this plan. MASKS MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES and sanitizing stations will be set up with recording of contact details for tracing purposes, if required.

With regards to the distribution of Holy Eucharist, The Archbishop asks that Holy Eucharist is received by hand only (and not directly on the tongue), as a precautionary step to protect against COVID-19. This is not done lightly, because in normal circumstances the Church in Australia does not limit reception of the Sacrament to one way or another. This is not a permanent situation and will be reviewed at each significant change in the Victorian Roadmap. The Archbishop will lift this requirement at the earliest opportunity. We trust that you will understand and adhere to this guideline.

From the weekend of 14th/15th November, 50 people will be allowed at outdoor gatherings. Bookings will be essential - by email or by phoning the relevant number shown in the parish update on this page.

The **Ready, Set, Pray!** Children's Liturgy of the Word @ Home video series has been created to provide an engaging space for families to encounter Jesus through the Sunday gospel.



Each week includes an invitation for families to gather in their own prayer space, to sing, hear the Gospel, pray and respond creatively through an activity.

This weekly resource follows the familiar Children's Liturgy of the Word format provided in many parishes – but moved to an online setting. It can be used by families in their homes, and also by teachers and catechists. The series consists of 10 weekly sessions of 15-20 minutes duration, which commenced from Sunday 18th October and continues each Sunday until

Fr Joseph's Homily for 33rd Sunday, Year A, 2020

Once upon a time two frogs fell into an open bowl of cream. The frogs couldn't climb out of the bowl and neither of them could swim. The first frog said to himself, "This is hopeless." And he just allowed himself to sink to the bottom. The second frog said, "I can't escape and I can't swim but at least I can splash around this cream and postpone my death for a while." And that is what he did.

A poem is written about this event by an unknown author. It says, "The more he swam, his legs aflutter, the more the cream turned into butter. On top of the butter at last he stopped, and out of the bowl he gaily hopped."

When we do nothing – nothing happens. Or sometimes failure comes upon us (the first frog). But when we try – sometimes we are surprised at what happens.

Sometimes someone comes to our aid unexpectedly. Sometimes we discover abilities which we did not know that we had, or sometimes laws of nature which we were not aware of take effect (cream turns into butter).

In today's gospel (Matt 25:14-30), the third man had been given 1000 talents and failed to try. If he had tried and failed it would have been all right. But, like the first frog in our story, he failed to try. In today's gospel Jesus encourages us to go ahead and try. He tells us not to worry about the future. He says. "The Spirit will tell you what to say." Have you ever said, or heard other people say, "Oh, I can't join the choir, I can't be a reader. I can't be a Eucharistic Minister, I can't do this and I can't do that!" and the master said, "You lazy, cowardly fellow!"

Pandemic Reflection

During this Coronavirus pandemic, many are tempted to fear, anxiety and perhaps even despair. Some have lost their precious lives, some have lost those whom they love, some have suffered through the debilitating effects of this illness, some have lost their jobs, their income, and most have encountered much disruption to the normal flow of their daily lives. Every crisis in life is an opportunity to turn to our beloved Saviour in trust and complete abandonment so as to rest in His merciful hands. To rest in the hands of the God means we are secure, despite the uncertainty of life. It means we are free to love God and others, despite the challenges we face. It means we raise our eyes to Heaven, rather than look down in fear.

A Prayer to Combat the Coronavirus Pandemic:

Most Merciful God, we come to you in our weakness. We come to you in our fear. We come to you with trust. For you alone are our hope.

We place before you the disease present in our world. We turn to you in our time of need. Bring wisdom to doctors. Given understanding to scientists. Endow caregivers and nurses with compassion and generosity. Bring healing to those who are ill. Protect those who are most at risk. Give comfort to those who have lost a loved one. Welcome those who have died into your Eternal Home.

Stabilize our communities. Unite us in our compassion. Remove all fear from our hearts. Fill us with confidence in your care and grace. Jesus, I trust in you. Amen.
