The Most Holy Trinity

The Blessed Trinity – the one God we profess is three Persons whom we name + Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and described as Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier – or Wholeness Maker – is at the heart of who we are as Christ People. For it is the God whom Jesus makes real to us in himself and his Good News. This is our core Mystery or Wonder – So why not wonder? Not puzzled but in glad amazement and grateful trust.

Our Eucharist is" Making Thanks". Another Greek word is, "Perichoresis", from the early (Greek-speaking) Church - which can be related to "choreography" or even "chorus" or "choir", and was an attempt to express the inexpressible the inner life and action of the Trinity.

A recent translation or rendition comes from Father Richard Rohr OFM, "The Divine Dance", also the title of his beautiful book. But a dance in which we are all included.



In the icon above there is an empty rectangle below the cup; scholars suggest it was originally a mirror to include the viewer. Be included and so be inclusive of all in your life: all is graced in the Blessedness of the Trinity; as graced we are all mediators or channels of grace. "How wonderful is your name in all the earth Let us rejoice and be glad!! Alleluia!!!"

Working with Children Check

We Care

Responding to the Voluntary Assisted Dying Act.

From the earliest times, Christ's followers have set themselves apart by their care of the vulnerable (Acts 4:34). On 19 June 2019, the Voluntary Assisted Dying Act (VAD) comes into effect. It legalises euthanasia and assisted suicide. Despite what the law may say, our Christian tradition affirms that every life, including those of the sick and suffering, is sacred. Euthanasia and assisted suicide are never part of end of life care.

Pope Francis has encouraged ordinary Catholics everywhere to resist euthanasia and to protect the old, the young and the vulnerable from being cast aside in a "throw-away culture." We are called to follow Christ by accompanying people with compassion, sharing hope not fear.

The Bishops of the Catholic dioceses of Melbourne, Ballarat, Sale and Sandhurst, echoing Pope Francis, have published a pastoral letter including practical guidance on ways we can be conscientious objectors to euthanasia.

June 16, 2019 - The Most Holy Trinity Sunday

"But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth..." (John 16:13)

Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to help us know and live the truth. To prepare ourselves, we need to open our hearts to receive this gift before we can give it. Develop a daily prayer routine. Talk and listen to the Holy Spirit. This is best done in silence, when we can hear His response. The Trinity is an icon created by Russian painter& rei Rublev (c 1409)& depicts the threeangels who visited Abraham at the Oak ofMamre (Genesis 18:1-8).But the painting is full of symbolism and isinterpreted as an icon of the Holy Trinity.At the time of Rublev, the Holy Trinity wasregarded as the embodiment of spiritual unity,peace, harmony, mutual love & humility.



Perhaps you could download and contemplate a fuller image of the icon; anyway, spend gentle prayer time before the icon - an icon is described as a "doorway into the Divine -: and even put yourself & then maybe your family and community in the mirror place. Join in the Divine Dance and really dance!

The Book of Proverbs 8, 22-33 "The Wisdom of God cries out loud, The LORD created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago......from before the earth came into being......then I was by his side him, as a master worker, playing before him all the while, playing over the whole of his earth, delighting to be at play with all humankind "Now, children, listen to me; happy are they who keep my ways."

This may seem an unusual reading for the Feast- it doesn't mention Trinity at all! - but it does!! Read the whole passage. It's an incredible Creation - Trinitarian story, singing of our Creator-Redeemer- Sanctifier God who delights "to be with all humankind, the daughters and sons of God". As you pray, perhaps begin to concentrate on the God of delight and play, rather than of collection of faults and corrections. And so dance with our Dancing God! and with each other!!
