

Where's ~~Wally~~ JESUS?

We know Jesus is everywhere but during Mass He liturgically moves around quite a bit.

As we gather before the service begins He is with us in the foyer and pews. "Where two or three are gathered in my name I am with them".

At the beginning of Mass He is present in the person of the Priest as He shows His love and mercy to us in the Penitential Rite. Then He moves to the Ambo (lectern) to speak to us through the voices of the readers and the Priest.

During the Offertory Procession He joins with our representatives in presenting the gifts and ourselves to His, and our, Father.

During the Eucharistic Prayer He makes Himself really present in the Eucharist at the words of Consecration under the appearance of bread and wine.

At the Sign of Peace He joins each of us in wishing our companions well.

Then at Communion He enters each of us in a very personal way, and at the dismissal He stays with each of us so that we can carry Him out of the Church building into our families and the world.

ANTI-POVERTY WEEK October 14-20th 2018

Anti-Poverty week is a week where all Australians are encouraged to organise or take part in an activity aiming to highlight or overcome issues of poverty and hardship here in Australia or overseas. It was established in Australia as an expansion of the UN's annual International Day for the Eradication of Poverty.

The main aims of Anti-Poverty Week are to:

Strengthen public understanding of the causes and consequences of poverty and hardship around the world and in Australia and

Encourage research, discussion and action to address these problems, including action by individuals, communities, organisations and governments.

Poverty and severe hardship affects more than a million Australians. Around the world, more than a billion people are desperately poor. In Anti-Poverty Week, you too can help fight poverty and hardship.

Pope Francis has instituted the annual World Day of the Poor for November 19th. In his inaugural message for the day (2017) he says:

Blessed, therefore, are the open hands that embrace the poor and help them; they are the hands that bring hope. Blessed are the hands that reach beyond every barrier of culture, religion and nationality, and pour the balm of consolation over the wound of humanity. Blessed are the open hands that ask nothing in exchange., with no 'ifs' or 'buts' or 'maybes' they are the hands that call down God's blessings upon their brothers and sisters.
