UNTHINKABLE

The Gulf War ended in Iraq on Thursday February 27, 1991. Twelve hours after the end of the war, two army officers walked into a factory in Kansas, U.S.A.to tell a mother that her son, Clayton, had died in the war. The mother was crushed.

Then, thirty hours later, while the mother was still crying in her own kitchen, the telephone rang. She picked up the phone and she heard the words, "Mom, it's Clayton! I'm alive. I'm just a little bit wounded in the foot, but I'm okay. I'm, already walking around on crutches."

We can all imagine the initial sorrow of such a mother, and the overwhelming joy she experienced at hearing the assuring voice of her son.

Wounded hands and feet, he was still alive. Alleluia!

What that Gulf War mother experienced when she heard the voice of her son was a faint reflection of what that mother at the foot of the cross experienced when, early on Easter Sunday morning, she heard, and saw, and touched, the glorious body of her son, risen from the dead.

We don't read in the Gospels about the appearance of Jesus to his mother after his resurrection, but as St. Ignatius of Loyola says, and as many Catholic traditions tell us, "To Whom would Jesus choose to appear first, if not to his grieving mother?"

Would Jesus appear to Mary Magdalene, and not appear first to his grieving mother?

For the Christian, that is unthinkable.

Plenary 2020 Update: 222,000 have contributed to national dialogue

The Listening and Dialogue phase of preparation for the Plenary Council 2020 is now complete and over 220,000 people contributed to the process. The National Centre for Pastoral Research is conducting a qualitative and quantitative analysis of the submissions received and, using best-practice research methods, are undertaking the important task of identifying the key themes that have emerged. The timeline for the process can be accessed via the Plenary Council website and it is envisaged that by the end of May the national themes for discernment will be finalised. These themes will then become the focus of the Listening and Discernment phase which will commence in June (Pentecost). Further detail about how this next phase will unfold will be available toward the end of May.
