### Reflection

One day an old mule fell into a deep dry well. The neighbours couldn't |lift up the mule so the owner decided to bury the mule at the bottom of the unused well. The neighbours began to fill the well with soil. At first, the mule panicked, but after a while, after the mule shook off the soil and pounded it under his feet, the mule was no longer in panic. In fact, after a while, the mule arrived at the top of the well, with all the thrown soil under his feet. Exhausted and dirty, the mule had survived because it knew how to shake off the soil and rise higher. In today's gospel (Luke 9:51-62)

Jesus shows us how to shake off little disappointments and how to get on with life. Jesus had wanted to pass through a Samaritan town on his way to Jerusalem. "But," the gospel says, "the Samaritans would not welcome him." James and John were upset by this refusal of hospitality, and they said, "Lord, would you not have us call down fire from heaven and destroy them?" In effect, Jesus said. "Never mind. Shake off this little

Jesus said, "Never mind. Shake off this little disappointment and let's get on with the living of life." Just as the old mule knew how to shake off the soil and rise higher, we too can rise higher by being patient with the disappointments of life, by praying for those who may wittingly or unwittingly throw soil upon us, by forgiving, by forgetting, by not Jetting ourselves get side-tracked by life's little disappointments
