REVEILLE

Winston Churchill, England's famous Prime Minister during World War II, planned very well his funeral in St. Paul's Cathedral.

He gave instructions that towards the end of the ceremony a bugler was to play "Taps," was the military signal that the day was ended.

But as soon as "Taps" was finished another bugler was to play "Reveille" (It's time to get up, it's time to get up, etc.) the military's signal to rise and begin a new day.

It was dramatic expression of Winston Churchill's belief that there is life after death.

In today's Second Reading (1 Cor 15:54-58) St Paul is telling us that death is not the end, and that death is not victorious. He says, "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting? "

Yes, at our death, one bugler will play "Taps", but immediately the second bugler will play for us "Reveille"

It's going to be a wonderful new day that will never have another "Taps."



Living the Gospel Learning Together Creating Our Future

A Reflection 8th Sunday of the Year, Year C 26–27 February 2022



"For One's Words Flow Out of What Is In One's Heart"_Luke 6.45

The readings of these past few Sundays (check Luke 6.17-40), began in an earlier simple Saturday afternoon story: "Now, one Sabbath, Jesus happened to be taking a walk through the cornfields & his disciples were picking ears of corn, rubbing them in their hands, & eating them". You can almost taste the sweetness & feel the juice running down; a treat any one of us may know or would love to, especially by a sunny lake shore. But....But.... Some of the Pharisee said, "Why are you doing something that is forbidden on the Sabbath day?" They definitely knew how to get up Jesus' nose, whose final word to them was, "The Son of Man is Master of the Sabbath".

But this simple tale and quick exchange led to the extraordinary & totally radical Teaching & Life Map that lies at the very heart of the Good News and of authentic living as a Christ disciple or Christian community. Raising the question –Can I? Can We? Do I? Do We?_Believe it_? Do it_? Live it? Today & every day? This Life Map is often called The Beatitudes – or The Blessings - & referred to as the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), or the Sermon from the Plain (Luke 6. 17-49), and its call to the daily personal & community practice of goodness, honesty, justice, faithfulness, care, truth & love et cetera was, & is, at odds with so many of our worldly values and our daily actions & goals.

They can also be described as the "Be-Attitudes" for Christian living; for fair dinkum discipleship, a discipleship of loving service that will/ would change the world. If only, if only.....We keep on dropping out, falling down, mucking up, lashing out, giving up. And isn't that the truth, eh? For each & every one of us. As G K Chesterton (a most prolific author of all sorts of high-end writing & scholarly literature - & of Father Brown, Detective) observed many decades ago, "Christianity has not been tried & found wanting - but is still wanting to be tried" (my rendering). And does that not fit right in with our experiences & anxieties in everyday thoughts, hesitations & fears, as we hear and see daily news of war & its warnings; want, exclusion, rejection & everyday awfulness, abandonment & hurt. What to do? What to do?

Then along comes Lent – the opportunity to be smudged with ash in acknowledgement of our fragile selves; in the sign of the cross marking & recognizing our believing, hoping selves ;& with the Jesus words, "*Hear The Gospel & Turn From Sin*". Again, a chance to spend 40 volunteer days in my chosen desert; checking myself out, restoring my spiritual resources, growing in my reading & prayer; forgiving & re-committing in my Journey to Easter. Time to check out the "*planks in my own eye*" & making time to understand the "*planks in my neighbour's eye*"." Now is the acceptable time" (2 Corinthians 6.2). A sacred time/ opportunity to again commit to my journey to a Renewed Easter Self. I can do it.
