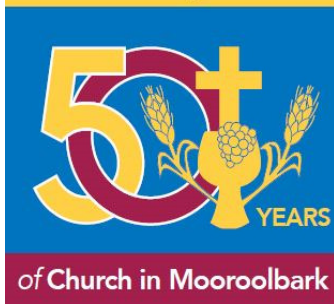

We all have “blind spots”.

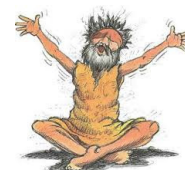
Some parents have “blind spots”.

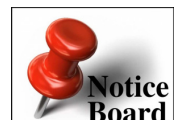
