During this difficult time, parishioners are encouraged to continue to support the Parish financially. This support is essential to the ongoing weekly expenditure of our Parish.


Thanksgiving envelopes can be dropped off at the Parish Office. (left side of front door).

### Bishop Mark Edwards OMI appointed next Bishop of Wagga Wagga

Pope Francis has appointed Bishop Mark Edwards OMI as the sixth bishop of the Diocese of Wagga Wagga. In accepting his appointment, Bishop Mark wrote to the people of Wagga Wagga saying, "I experience this appointment as a call from God to be with you and to journey with you as disciple, brother and bishop." Archbishop Peter A Comensoli thanked Bishop Edwards for his service as an Auxiliary Bishop of Melbourne and acknowledged his missionary zeal, "especially in his work with our young people and tertiary communities, and with the people of the Western Region of the Archdiocese for whom he has cared for these past years as their Regional Bishop. He will be well-placed to listen to and lead the people of God in Wagga Wagga."

### Pentecost Sunday, Year A, 2020

One time there was a little 5 years old boy who was somewhat of a prodigy at the piano.

His parents were friends of the great pianist, Ignace Paderewski. One day they invited Paderewski to their home. The parents tied to get their son to play his best piece in front of Paderewski, but the little boy was too embarrassed to do so. Paderewski then sat down at the piano, and together with the little boy, began to play beautifully.

The feast of Pentecost is something like that. On the first Pentecost day, the Holy Spirit sat down with the nervous apostles, and together they began to play beautifully. The playing has continued up to the present. Another image of what Pentecost is like is the image of a relay race at the moment one runner passes the baton stick to his teammate. At Pentecost, the baton is passed on from Jesus to the apostles who are filled with the Holy Spirit.

Composer Giacomo Puccini died of cancer before he could finish the opera, "Turandot." He said to his students, "Finish it for me." In 1926, Puccini's favourite student, Arturo Toscanini, directed the premiere of "Turandot" in the Milan Opera House. When the opera reached the point where Puccini's music ended, Toscanini stopped the music and said, "At this point the master had to stop." There was a brief silence and then Toscanini continued, "But the disciples finished his work." At the conclusion of the opera, the audience welcomed the world's newest masterpiece with tremendous applause. At Pentecost, the disciples began to complete the work of the Master who is Jesus.
