PASSION SUNDAY 5th April 2020 Issue No 11



This year, we reflect on Matthew's passion story through the lens of a global community threatened by a virus. Jesus' entry into Jerusalem begins on a huge wave of optimism, joy and hope. People line the streets; they wave palms, they put their cloaks and garments on the ground and they shout out his name. This was an ancient Roman tradition used to welcome soldiers and armies home after their success in battle. The crowd welcomes Jesus in a similar way as they shout out, Hosanna, Hosanna.

How quickly the crowd changed and turned on Jesus. The same people who were happy to welcome him with shouts of joy, will soon begin to shout 'Crucify him, Crucify him.' Jesus is even betrayed and denied by his closest friends. The rest of them run and desert him. He is left alone! In isolation and feeling abandoned.

If we are not careful we can lose sight of what is important to us. As well as celebrating this great week with dignity and reverence, we also need to ask ourselves what it is all about and what it means to each of us in today's world with today's challenges? How can we reach out to others and make sure our fears and stockpiling is not affecting others.

This week we are offered hope. We have the potential to bring hope to all at this time, especially to those who are putting their lives on the line for others.

Homily

WHAT IS YOUR WORTH?

Today the priest will bless the palms that people bring to the church to commemorate Jesus' triumphant entry to Jerusalem.

In Matthews account, Jesus instructed the disciples to get hold of a donkey and they brought the donkey and the colt and placed their cloaks on them for Jesus to sit on" (Matthew 21:7).

A very large crowd then spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them along His path. The crowds that went ahead of Him and those that followed shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!

Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

I would like to share with you this story about the donkey Jesus sat on. It was talking to a fellow donkey after Jesus' entry to Jerusalem.

People are strange. Just days before, they were all going crazy over me, shouting praises and hosannas. But now, no one cares about me. I feel like I'm nothing.

The fellow donkey responded, "That's just the way it is. Without Jesus, we are nothing". Without Jesus, we are nothing. Let that sink in.

During the first Sunday of Lent, Jesus was thrice tempted by the devil: "If You are the Son of God . . ." It was a triple temptation to performance, possession, and popularity. Don't we face the same temptation today? We base our self-worth according to our performance, possession, and popularity.

But performance, possession, and popularity are finite resources. Sooner or later, they fade and we find ourselves left with nothing—like the donkey in our story.

Jesus is our infinite resource. With Jesus "on our back," we are someone! We are of worth, of infinite worth! Let that sink in.
