Gospel Reflection:

I mentioned last week that my moniker for the week will be "Prepare for the joy in Jesus". I'm still hanging onto that in the busy week I've had and conscious of the countdown to Christmas getting even shorter. Another week before Christmas would be a real bonus in order to get everything complete but I suspect that we are all waiting for this year to be over so granting me a 53 week year for 2020 is not on the cards.

I'm sure that your Christmas planning is going OK, hopefully not to overwhelming but great news that we can have more people in our homes for Christmas if we choose to do so. This third Sunday of Advent, the Sunday that reminds us all that the lead up to Christmas is meant to be a joyous time, a reminder that Jesus has come already with the Good News but we need to instill that news into our hearts.

Let's remember that Jesus has come and is yet to come at the same time. We are still seeking the God who is here but is yet to come. Meister Eckhart, a 14th century Dominican preacher and mystic was asked why people could be reluctant to seek God. He replied that when someone is looking for something and finds not

a trace of it, they become discouraged and keep to the search only with reluctance. If they find a trace of it, they will take up the search with renewed energy. We have caught a trace, a glimpse of God in the baby Jesus born to us but we also wait for the time when we will see God face to face. May our seeking be one that is full of rejoicing.



Christmas Eve Family Mass: If you are attending the Christmas Eve Family Mass on St. Louis' School Oval please come early (5pm onwards) to avoid the last minute queues (you need a mask on you if social distancing is compromised). You will be directed to your spot by the Covid Marshalls (welcomers). Please bring a fold out seat or picnic blanket as no seating will be supplied. Please note that this is a Mass and it is inappropriate to bring food and drink to the Mass other than water. Words for the songs will be via a QR code so we encourage you to use your device and bring extra devices for children. In the event that the weather compromises the outdoor experience we will move into the School Hall but numbers will be greatly reduced. 


