#### **Christmas Reflection:**

Pope Francis has claimed 2021 as the year of St Joseph. In Pope Francis' recent Apostolic Letter - *Patris Corde* on Joseph he has called us to be creatively and courageous like Joseph. WITH A FATHER'S HEART: that is how Joseph loved Jesus, whom all four Gospels refer to as "the son of Joseph"

2020 what a year! Our lives have been "woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked." I could list so many ordinary people whose lives have played such a significant role in 2020, the carers the cleaners, medical staff, truck drivers, supermarkets workers and police departments just to name a few. However, there have also been people like you and me, those who have put themselves out and, possibly in danger to care for family members. There are those who have prayed



and prayed and those who have continually checked on friends and perhaps neighbours they didn't know so well. There have been many stories of how people have extended the hand of friendship, care and concern.

St Joseph was a wonderful man whose heart remained loyal to his son Jesus and his wife Mary. He never took the spotlight, but, achieved all that he did without any *hooha*, as Pope Francis says he was a 'hidden presence'.

I know from listening to many of you and your stories of how you have cared for neighbours, friends and family there is in you a part of Joseph that has been passed down through the ages. A part that perhaps we were not even aware of, and yet I know it to be true. Many of these acts of love and care came from a 'hidden presence.' This being the year of St Joseph might be a great opportunity for us to model ourselves on this beautiful, hidden presence, this courageous gentle man. So as we look forward to 2021 with hearts filled with gratitude for all who helped us get through this unusual year may we do so with hope and love, trusting in the DNA of St Joseph that has touched each of us.

From Fr Andrew and myself, many, many thanks to all of you, for your friendly greetings, your outreach, your care and concern of family, friends, neighbours and the wider world. May our Good and Generous God continue to bless you all and fill your hearts with hope and love for 2021.
