

## **Gospel Reflection:**

In our gospel today, this sign of triumph greets the disciples who are in the room for fear of the lews. They are in a locked room and in the dark for they are a wounded lot huddled in fear. They have heard of resurrection the but something is preventing them from believing. It's in this state that **Iesus** appears before them



unnerving them but let's see how this occurs. Jesus breaks through the barriers of their fear and confusion which are obstacles that are more formidable than locked doors. Jesus came into their lives again and reassures them through the simple words: "Peace be with you". This is the peace that he mentioned at the last supper and now is being offered to them. Peace is the beginning of the healing process and the crucial ingredient is forgiveness.

Our experience of lockdown had us in "locked rooms" for fear of the virus. We are so fortunate now to be able to roam freely and do what we would like, when we like. Jesus came to free us from sin and oppression and call us to live freely in love but that requires our faith to believe that we are a forgiven people. Can we believe that?

Our churches have been closed during the lockdown but that didn't prevent us from praying, experiencing virtual masses and staying connected. It is timely that we resume our community life and begin to think about our parish's future. We may think that we can continue parish life as before but I feel that it is time that we stop and reflect on strengthening our parish experience. An opportunity to do that is coming up with the "Opening the Doors" presentations that I will be leading. Details are in this newsletter.

A question to ponder might be: If my faith is important to me, how can I bring others to understand that faith is important to them and will enhance their lives? Can I ask you to pray that this initiative will touch many people's hearts?


