6th Sunday of Easter - Year C – 25th & 26th May 2019 Our readings for this week are **ACTS 15: 1-2, 22-29; APOCALYSE 21: 10-14, 22-23; JOHN 14: 23-29**

Gospel Reflection: I read in a gospel commentary recently that the French language is sometimes more precise than English. "Goodbye" is a case in point. The French use *Au revoir* for those everyday brief separations, while *Adieu* is reserved strictly for a more final departure; it means roughly "until we meet in heaven." In many ways, life is a succession of *Au revoirs* and *Adieus*. The latter grow more with the passing years. Our hearts and memories are peopled with faces that once were dear to us. Some, like our parents, died. Others moved away out of our lives never to reappear again. If their names crop up in conversation we say, "I wonder what became of so-and-so." They may say the same about us too. Life is a series of little deaths until our own death which for us will be the last great *Adieu*.

In our life of faith we are a pilgrim people, on the move. We need faithful friends who travel with us. In today's gospel, Jesus alerts his disciples to his imminent departure, his ascension into heaven. He doesn't say *Adieu* but *Au revoir*. "I am going away, but I shall return." We never really say goodbye to God, for God always goes with us.

As I pen this reflection, I am very much aware of my impending "departure" from the parish. Next Thursday marks another chapter in my life as I take up my new appointment as Assistant Priest at Sacred Heart Parish in St Albans. But before I get to the business of saying "thank yous", allow me first to share a brief reflection on my stay here in Mordialloc-Aspendale. Two years ago when I first arrived, I had already set out some expectations for myself. Along with the physical stuff I brought with me are my "personal goals" and a long list of "target areas of involvement" in the parish that can potentially make my time here more meaningful and enjoyable. Looking back now, although I must admit I wasn't able to meet all the goals and expectations I listed, my expectations exceeded what I could ever imagine and hoped for. The first on the list was my intention to meet as many people as I can. To be honest, greeting people after Sunday Mass and at least remembering their names was enough for me to fulfil my goals. But what struck me is that what I thought to be only "two minute doorstep conversations" have slowly developed into friendships. To come here as a stranger and to be able to listen to your stories is truly a remarkable experience for me.

But what truly touched me are those quiet parishioners, who, out of the mundane, are living the gospel of Christ: An elderly woman caring for her also elderly mother, a loving wife who took care of her dying husband until his last breath and St. Vincent de Paul volunteers who quietly visit the homes and listen to the stories of the poor and less fortunate people of society to name a few. These are real people who do not

set high expectations on themselves; simply living as Christ lived, moving on silently in life with Christ at their side.

To Bernadette, Susan and Ann, the parish staff and especially to Fr. Andrew, thank you for being a mentor and friend to me. All of you have played a big part in my ministry. The fun memories we had will always be treasured in my heart.

To all the parishioners of St. Mary of the Cross Parish, I want to sincerely thank you all for welcoming me and inspiring me to become a better Christian. Although I am sad to leave you, I am optimistic of my future as I continue to minister to God's people. *Au revoir* and I hope to see you again one day. God bless. *Fr Justel*
