Gospel Reflection:

Very shortly my son is about to travel interstate for a holiday with friends. He is busily preparing for travels completing the return travel permit into Victoria, washing clothes, booking flights, organising transfers to and from the accommodation, establishing guidelines around eleven living together, friends accessing the best gym in the region and of course ensuring food is available in the house



and that the best places to eat have been sourced. His pre-organisation helps to ensure that when he reaches his destination that all involved will have a very positive experience. Undertaking an important journey we must be well prepared. As we set out on our journey to Easter, we must be clear about the destination that gives meaning to this journey.

Today's Gospel reading invites us to prepare ourselves along side Jesus. As He set out on the journey that ultimately led to Easter, he prepared himself by withdrawing to the desert and confronting the temptation to avoid the great task that lay ahead of Him. Jesus knew the weight of human decisions and the temptations involved. This testing brought Jesus new strength and he began sharing the Good News of the Gospel. With Jesus it is important during Lent that we recognise the nature of our temptations and the decisions we make. Temptation is a very real part of life and is especially challenging in our lowest times. Sometimes in our darkest hour we can be tempted to stray from our values. The pandemic and the subsequent lock downs have really challenged people's understanding of life. We have been tempted to listen to the voices that lead us away from God. Radio, television, internet voices tell us what is important in our lives. These voices tell us that the good in our lives.....the God in our lives.... is represented by money, power, security, fame. These are all good things but good things become evil when we start to be convinced that we don't need God in our lives.

In our lives there is always Good News that comes from struggle. Each time we overcome a challenge we are more prepared to meet the next one that comes our way. There will always be a struggle which helps to build character. Our experiences with COVID-19 and all the parameters imposed on us has forced us to slow down, reflect and honestly consider the really important things in our lives - our Faith, our family, our friends and our health.

We learn from Jesus that we meet the challenges of temptation by allowing God into our lives daily. Lent provides us with the perfect time to prepare and reflect on our own lives before the celebration of Easter. **Michelle Barron**


Parish Events
