### **Gospel Reflection:**

"We should like to see Jesus"



How many times have you said that to yourself?

I have wanted to see Jesus and ask him why? Why did this happen to me? Why did someone do that to another person?

I have wanted to see Jesus and ask him how?

How could he have allowed that to happen?

How will I get through this period in my life?

What are some of the experiences of loss in your life that have been followed by experiences of growth or new life?

Jesus declares that, 'unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest.' Jesus was as a grain of wheat. He died and was buried in the earth and that death was fruitful for the whole of humankind. He foresaw being nailed to the cross which would be dropped upright into a hole in the ground.

Our Lord says of that scene: 'When I am lifted up I will draw all people to myself.' How were people drawn to this scene?

People saw the length to which Jesus was prepared to go in order to persevere in his mission to live out the message that his Heavenly Father was full of mercy and wanted all people to share in Divine Life. This led to his being lifted up on the cross, being buried in the ground like a grain of wheat, only to rise to new life.

We could take a moment to pray that we will shortly see all this with the eyes of faith as we participate in the rituals of Good Friday and Easter. *Carmel Stutterd*
