## **Gospel Reflection:**

This week's Gospel, taken from Matthew's Gospel is the continuation of theme of the discipleship, with the focus on service. In the Gospel we are challenged to take up the cross and follow Iesus'



footsteps. In doing this we are urged to make all feel welcome.

In terms of acts of service, sometimes it is easy to picture bigger acts of service such as volunteering at a shelter or joining a missionary order and feel that this sort of service is unrealistic in your current lifestyle. But in the gospel, Jesus says, 'If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water' to a disciple spreading the gospel, then their ultimate reward is assured. To give 'a cup of cold water' or 'a cold drink' to another person was the most basic act of hospitality or service. It is a metaphor for doing the absolute least service to another. Jesus is saying that even the most trivial act of service that recognises the work of the disciple will be welcomed and acknowledged. It suggests that 'practical loving kindness' is both the test and the result of discipleship.

So how do you picture 'ordinary' service? Some jobs have great potential for simple human service, for example, smiling and being extra friendly as you bag groceries, looking out for what the children may need as you babysit, noticing whose coffee cup is empty as you wait on tables, or being sure the newspapers you deliver are always placed close to your customers' door. Here therefore are some of the questions the gospel asks of us - What are some simple things that you might do every day that can be compared to giving someone a cup of cold water? How will you make all feel welcome? *Iodie Marziano*
