following the rules, but being seen to be following the rules. The Gospel talks about being clean and not just coming to the table with clean hands, but washing up to the elbow, and returning from the markets the elders would sprinkle themselves with water.

As Christians we hold that God has given us free will, and evil's hold on our hearts is often the result of the poor choices and smaller compromises we have made along the way. (Richard Leonard SJ)

The way that they provide guidelines for behaviour, and more importantly how they embrace each of their children, even when they don't follow the rules, and show them that love is our strongest bond. May the love we have for our fathers and our children be the love we share with each other today.


