Our readings for this week are WISDOM 9: 13-18; PHILEMON 9-10, 12-17; LUKE 14: 25-33

Gospel Reflection:

Twenty years ago I worked in aged care as a personal career. Our manager was verv inconsistent, she had her favourites, and she had those she didn't like. Sometimes her treatment of these more vulnerable folks was cruel. I tried to be the fix-it woman, I would spend time with those she was giving a hard time or just being plain neglectful to. Gospel values and the teachings of Jesus were everything to me and I sat with Jesus feeling scared and vulnerable myself (I had only been working there six or seven years) wondering how I could follow in Jesus' footsteps in this situation. The manager had many close friends in the work place, and I was the new girl. It took me a little while to pluck up the courage but, I resigned and made an

appointment at Head Office with management and reported the many issues I considered to be abuse. After the aged care experience I worked as a receptionist in a podiatrist surgery, it was a very busy practice. I can remember a number of times my boss would come out of his room to see if I had finished typing a letter for him, only to find me still standing talking to an elderly person about a particular issue they were facing. He would look at me from his doorway and say in a very quiet voice, "still counselling?"

What's all this got to do with today's gospel you might be asking? Well, for me everything. Yes as it turned out this time I had a wonderful boss who knew that some of these people had very little support in their lives, and as a very compassionate man he allowed this extended listening to folks to continue for ten years.

I realise that if I couldn't listen to these people as they needed to be listened to I would have to resign, because I knew this for me was part of being a disciple, listening to the needs of others.

Jesus doesn't really want people to hate their parents. Sometimes He was prone to exaggeration, he was trying to bring home the commitment and the cost of discipleship. Jesus does want us to love Him more, but if we love Jesus with every ounce of our being then, as St Julian of Norwich says, 'all will be well', even when it is unbelievably difficult. **Bernadette Carr**
