# 26th Ordinary Sunday - Year C – 28th & 29th September 2019

Our readings for this week are AMOS 6: 1, 4-7: 1 TIMOTHY 6: 11-16; LUKE 16: 19-31

#### **Gospel Reflection:**

The parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus showcases the outcome of the failure to undergo conversion to faith in Jesus and the Good News. Without conversion, the rich man continues to live his luxurious lifestyle while ignoring and taking no action to relieve Lazarus from his situation. The consequence, as we are told is the former found himself in eternal suffering.

Conversion would include loving and caring for those that God loves. It involves taking concrete actions to care for and protect others, especially the poor. God, who takes notice of the suffering and pain of the poor, the needy and the neglected, acts to free them from their difficult circumstances. That is why conversion to the Good

circumstances. That is why conversion to the Good News would also include participating in or becoming an instrument of God's liberating action.

To a converted person, to live a life of comfort and affluence and to remain silent while a great number of peoples suffer injustices and abuse whilst others languish in misery and poverty, is unacceptable.

We might ask ourselves, who is the "Lazarus" sitting at my gate? Our efforts to reach out to those in need include not only those who are deprived materially but also to those who are suffering from poverty of soul and spirit.

We need to be certain about what truly matters to us, for it matters now and it matters eternally. As Jesus says, "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters you do unto me."
