Gospel Reflection:

When we like a new contraption, we may say: "That's the best thing since sliced bread". Can you believe that the first bread-slicing machine was made Otto Rohwedder and put into commercial use in 1928 only to come up against stiff opposition? Melbourne bakers in 1942 voted to prohibit slicing and wrapping machines feeling that the process was unnatural. By the end of the 20th century, Australians were spending \$359 million a year on sliced bread.

So many people who encountered Jesus would have embraced the sentiments of the saying "Jesus is the best thing since sliced bread." Yet the religious authorities in Jesus' time for some reason weren't open to change. They had God all worked out according to their principles and Jesus didn't fit their mold who then paid the price for their hard heartedness. The religious authorities were the ones who wouldn't have accepted bread slicing machines. We don't want to fall into this category no matter how ambiguous life is. We want to be open to God's presence in living out the ambiguity of our lives. Not everything is black and white and the grey areas require us to discern through the lens of faith.

To maximise our ability to love, we continually return to the vineyard of our lives and ask God to assist us in the nurturing of the soil and watering of the plants. We invite God to enter into the ambiguity of our lives and to provide clarity. In our weakness we allow God to be most powerful and at these times we echo the words of our psalmist: "Visit this vine and protect it, the vine that your right hand has planted."


