Our readings for this week are HABAKUKK 1: 2-3, 2: 2-4; 2 TIMOTHY 1: 6-8, 13-14; LUKE 17: 5-9

Gospel Reflection:

The apostles said to the Lord: "Increase our faith." Jesus replies: "If you have had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you."

The apostles worked with Jesus. They saw the miracles that he was working. They saw the healings and the liberation of an oppressed people, they even saw Jesus raise Lazarus from the dead. Why ask for more? Surely they are the privileged ones. They witnessed Jesus and his ministry first hand.

What if we were there 2,000 years ago and witnessed Jesus first hand? We would be his number one ticket holder. We would be wearing the scarf and flying the Jesus flag. So what was wrong with those apostles? They need to wake up to themselves.

Well, we know that many people encountered Jesus but did not believe. I am actually glad that I wasn't there 2,000 years ago. What if I was sceptical? The pressure would've been on. Hindsight for us is a great thing. We know that faith is not about seeing or



hearing but it is about loving. The more we love the more our faith increases. They are dependent on one another. If we focus more on loving then our faith will naturally increase. But to love is to risk. To risk is to be made vulnerable. To be vulnerable includes the potential for pain. But there is no other way. Jesus tells us so. **Fr. Andrew**
