

Gospel Reflection:

When reading scripture, there are two questions that help guide my reflection- in this scripture 'How can I know God?' and 'What does God ask of me?'

This week's gospel, The Parable of the Banquet, is an important one for understanding Jesus' message of an inclusive kingdom. The invitation to the people off the street, 'bad and good alike', is a reflection of Jesus' own attitude to sharing table. Jesus ate with those who were regarded as unworthy: tax collectors, prostitutes and sinners. It was one of the harshest criticisms of Jesus made



by the Pharisees and Scribes: 'He eats with tax collectors and sinners!' One of Jesus' strongest messages was about the inclusive nature of the kingdom and he lived it day to day. His inclusive table fellowship was a powerful statement about the fact that the kingdom is an invitation to all – rich and poor alike, regardless of status in this world. If we believe the king in the parable is God, then the hospitality of this king. 'Invite everyone you find to the wedding!' he says, tells us that our God is one of hospitality whose table is open to all.

This leads to the second question, 'What does God ask of me?' We are all invited to God's banquet, but not all accept the invitation. Which group do you fall into? The first people invited are those who reject God's way of living. The second people are those who don't expect the invitation but are delighted when it comes, and they accept it wholeheartedly. And the person not properly dressed represents those who may say that they have accepted God's invitation, but whose life choices show that they have not yet really said yes to God. As Jesus says at the end of this story, "Many are called, but few are chosen." Many were called and invited to attend the banquet. But more than that was expected of them. They had to answer the call by saying a total "yes" to Jesus through their words and actions. We are called to not only accept the invitation but to also to change our ways, to live as followers of Jesus. We are further challenged as God's presence in the world to reflect on- Who are the 'shunned' and 'left out' in our society today? Where do the boundaries lie? Who would Jesus be reaching out to and seeking to include in today's society? Who will we invite to the banquet?



Bids open at **5pm** on **Friday 16**th **October** and close at **5pm** on **Sunday 18**th **October**


