Our readings for this week are: GENESIS 2: 18-24; HEBREWS 4: 12-13; MARK 10: 17-30

Gospel Reflection:

Some years ago I heard a story about a wealthy couple, the other half - the husband is renowned for his love of money that he even sleeps with it. Due to an unfortunate turn of events, the husband passed away. People came to pay their respect. One of the husband's business partners asked the wife, "Did you put money in his casket?" the wife replied "I put a cheque in for him."

This week's Gospel can be read in 3 parts. First, Jesus tells the rich young man to give away what is dear to him, his riches. There is certainly nothing wrong with being wealthy so long it does not hinder our union with God, although it is an obstacle for many. Wealth is a sign of hard work over the years applying diligently one's skills and knowledge. It becomes an issue when wealth is all



about us and not about the other. A great number of rich people have helped their poorer neighbours. We read about the good works of charities founded by countless affluent people. The second part is connected to the first, more so of an elaboration. Having wealth gives one a sense of security, total reliance on it; however, it leaves no room for God's providence. Entering the Kingdom of God seems like an impossible task when it is interpreted by human standards. For God it can be done. Not everyone has such wealth and now the attention turns to something else. The third and final part broadens the scope of wealth or attachment, from financial wealth to the apostles' situation in life, familial wealth. The apostles had other riches, their family. Our families are our greatest treasure on earth. For the disciples it was a radical way of following Jesus to leave it all behind. Leaving it all behind does not necessarily mean neglecting our family members when they are sick. After all, Jesus visited those people were sick in need of healing. While the first and third parts differ, there is a common aspect of loving God unreservedly.

Families are apostles in their own right when charity is exercised at home and outside of their homes. Charity helps us to consider others. Considering others require us to detach ourselves from things preventing us to love fully. There are plenty of examples of people who we know, and those in our own parishes who volunteer in different works by giving up their time. At times, these efforts may seem unnoticed and unrewarding but Jesus promises us a great reward that is worth a hundred times.




