Gospel Deflection:

Although it is the end of January, we still embrace new beginnings. School begins this week possibly to the relief of many parents, and teachers head back to the classroom to start their ministry with our young people. Our ordered cycle of readings begin today with the first verses from Luke's gospel, whose gospel we will hear from extensively this year.

Luke's gospel begins with a great emphasis on the Holy Spirit, actually throughout his gospel we have references to the work of the Holy Spirit and today, as Jesus attends the synagogue, we have Jesus telling the attendees that he is the one to fulfil Isaiah's prophecy and will do so under the power of the Holy Spirit.

On this our National day long weekend, in our Great Southland of the Holy Spirit, we are invited to celebrate all things Australian. We are invited to recommit to living as Australians who continue to fulfil our call to mission by continuing to "bring good news to the poor....".

In the first reading, we have the retelling of the story of Ezra, of the city that has now been restored and rededicated. Ezra takes the scroll to be enthroned again and this

> becomes a cause for extravagant celebration for God has brought them all back together again and Ezra is quick to remind them that "rejoicing in the Lord will be your strength".

May we do the same as we pray with gratitude for our beautiful Australia. Yes we aren't perfect and we need to work on being the country that Jesus would be proud of, but we need to stop and take stock of all the blessings that have come our way.




