

Gospel Reflection:

This Gospel helps us to focus on the here and now. It helps us to live totally in the present, to look for and find God there. If we do that then the rest will take care of itself.

How many of us have ever run out of fuel? Current statistics suggest that at least 800,000 drivers a year call for help because they have run out of petrol Besides flat tyres, dead



batteries, and misplaced keys, running out of fuel ranks right up there with one of the main reasons people call for roadside service. It would be easier to explain if this happened a generation ago, when fuel gauges were not entirely accurate and when all of the warning lights of our day were non-existent. But now we have warning messages that our fuel is running low and then additional progressively urgent warnings indicating just how many estimated miles of driving we have left. One must say that most people who run out of fuel are "without excuse." Why, then, do we do it, seemingly as often today as people did years ago, when all of the advantages of technology were not available? In the parable it is not the fuel that is lacking it is the oil - it is the five bridesmaids who ran out of fuel. Taking Matthew's words literally it is suggested that the difference between the foolish virgins and the wise virgins was one thing: the wise virgins had oil for the lamps, while the foolish virgins did not. The wise virgins had the opportunity to obtain oil, and did so. The foolish virgins had plenty of opportunity to procure oil, but did not. The five foolish virgins had no oil for the very same reasons people continue to run out of gas, even when the flashing message on their instrument panel tells them they are. Firstly, people in both situations do not believe the warning signs. Secondly, those who run out of gas are lulled into a false confidence by the fact that everything appears to be fine at the moment. Jesus told us that He would come at a time when we did not expect Him. He warns us not to be complacent and lulled into a false sense of security. He will come at a time when it seems we are doing just fine. Thirdly, those who run out of fuel are those who wrongly suppose that they still have plenty of time to get it later. Similarly, those who think they will have other chances to come to faith in Jesus are making a very dangerous assumption.

The story of this parable is very simple, and the lesson is obvious: "So stay awake and watch, because you do not know either the day or the hour." The moral of the story: do not be superficial. Look beyond the present moment, and try to discover the call of God even in the smallest things of life, even the oil which may be lacking in the small light or lamp. **Michelle Barron**

I think that I can safely say that from Monday onwards we are allowed 20 people to be present at mass. An increase from 10. If so, then hopefully in a few more weeks' time we might increase it to 50 or the 4 square meter rule. Let us pray that this will be the case. Regardless, bookings for mass are essential for a guaranteed spot. Arriving unannounced may result in being turned away. The parish website allows you to do so online or else ring the parish office from Monday onwards during business hours.

As with many events this year, Graduation for Year 12's at St. Bede's was an online experience on Wednesday evening. The IT and AV team at St. Bede's ran a very professional live graduation ceremony on YouTube. They are an amazing professional team. I continue to be grateful to this department at St. Bede's for providing the assistance for our recorded weekly mass. In particular, I would like to thank Hamish Dun for his incredible effort each week in producing the mass.

The next phase for our online mass experience will be to transition to an online live streaming experience. On Saturday the 14th November at 6pm & Sunday the 15th November at 11am, we will be streaming live from the church. I encourage you to click on the link (it will be on the parish website) and partake in this experience. The recorded mass will still be available for a number of weeks but eventually be replaced by the live stream. Both will be offered for about the next three weeks.



Child Safety is everyone's responsibility. Our Parish is committed to the care, wellbeing and protection of children, and vulnerable people in our community


