Gospel Reflection:

Leprosy was a general term that covered a wide variety of chronic skin diseases. It caused skin to break thus exuding bodily fluids. The issue here is bodily boundaries, not hygiene. Those with skin ailments were deemed unclean, were banished from the community, and were required to keep their distance from others, for anyone who had direct contact with someone or something unclean was considered unclean. Note that any disfiguring skin disease or rash was called leprosy.



You can hear the desperation of the leper in need of Jesus' healing touch when he pleads, 'If you want to, you can cure me.' But deep down he wonders who would want to have anything to do with a leper. Lepers are outcasts, the disfigured castoffs of a society that only wants perfection. Because social and religious alienation was so severe, it was believed that the condition was brought on by some kind of sin. Such thinking did not prevent Jesus from showing compassion.

Jesus does respond in a way far beyond this man's hopes. He touches him. He doesn't step back and cure from a distance with words, but actually reaches out and places his hand on this wretched human body. In this touch more than physical healing is accomplished. He is no longer alienated but has been joined by another

This encounter impacts also on Jesus. He now becomes the outcast as he is forced to stay outside the towns in places where no-one lives. The text doesn't tell us why this is and sometimes it is interpreted as if Jesus is so popular that he is besieged and so stays away from the villages. But it is also possible that the people are afraid of Jesus since he has had physical contact with a leper and so he is now considered diseased, and forced to live where lepers live.

Rather than physical leprosy, today's Gospel causes me to reflect on social and cultural leprosy. I think of those alienated from society today through mental illness, and our own ignorance and fear of such illness. I think of those who want to be part of our Australian community but we put up barriers because they are different – they are non-European, non-Christian, non-profitable. Even the COVID layer has created a social leprosy – no hugging, kissing or even hand shaking is allowed. Would Australia welcome Jesus? I suspect not. He comes from a Middle-Eastern country, has no financial backing or education, and has no essential trade qualification. If he managed to smuggle aboard a leaky boat seeking refugee status due to religious oppression, he would probably end up being processed off-shore or spending years in a detention centre.

In the reading today the leper says, 'If you want to, you can make me clean.' I think of the hundreds seeking asylum in this country saying to us, 'If you want to, you can help me.' But do we want to? How can we call ourselves Christians and not want to?

On a totally different and happier note we wish all members of the St Mary of the Cross a very happy Valentine's Day.



St Louis' Tennis Club: Annual Tennis Open Day on this **Sunday 14**th **February** is cancelled.


