Gospel Reflection:

This Sunday, we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The liturgy invites us to share in the joy and celebration of the people who cry out in praise of their Lord. This is followed by the reading of the Passion, where we walk with Jesus through his suffering and death. This celebration seems to combine



stories of joy and suffering, mistakes and successes, which are part of our daily lives as disciples. As Pope Francis states 'it somehow expresses the contradictory feelings that we too, the men and women of today, experience: the capacity for great love... but also for great hatred; the capacity for courageous self-sacrifice, but also the ability to "wash our hands" at the right moment; the capacity for loyalty, but also for great abandonment and betrayal'.

Mark's Gospel provides us with the first written account of the Passion and provides the basic shape for the other evangelists to follow. What is distinctive in Mark's interpretation is the emphasis given to Jesus' suffering and sense of abandonment. Mark's Gospel is written around the year 70 CE. It was a time of great turbulence and the small Christian community in Rome is under threat. Since the year 64 CE the emperor Nero had begun a wave of persecution of Christians, and in the year 70 Roman armies finally captured and destroyed Jerusalem. It was a time when the faith of believers was being tested. They might well have felt that God has abandoned them. We might well feel this way at different times in our life too.

For Mark, Jesus' passion is also about his disciples and their failure. The only disciple who is commended is the woman who anoints Jesus. The disciples all sleep during Jesus' distress in Gethsemane, then they all desert him. And then there is Peter. He is one of the first of the disciples to be called; Jesus changes his name and places great trust in him; he is witness to the most significant moments of Jesus' life; he is able to profess his faith in Jesus as the Christ and yet it is he who denies even knowing Jesus. We might have thought that Peter was Jesus' most loyal and faithful follower, yet it is he who can't stand up and claim that he was a follower of Jesus. During the gospel, we are challenged to reflect on how we too are like the disciples, like Peter- do we find it difficult to stand up for our faith?

As Christians, we know that this is not the end of the story but Mary Coloe PBVM suggests it would be wrong to hurry through this week and not enter into this dark and fearful place of abandonment. Many of us know this place. At some time in our life we too have voiced this cry of Jesus and found the heavens silent. This week we are to bring the memory of these times into our prayer with God. For in spite of appearances, in spite of the silence, God is here.

Jesus prays from his 'heart of darkness'. He speaks out his anguish to his God with words of protest and lament. In his prayer he draws to himself all who protest and lament, all who suffer unjustly, all who feel abandoned and reviled. May we feel God's presence in the silence and feel the Jesus love in His suffering.

Palm Sunday Walk For Refugees is on this Sunday 28th March.




This is a wonderful annual ecumenical and community-wide march to demonstrate solidarity for all refugees around the world.


