

Baptism Bookings

Families living in our Parish who wish to have a child baptised in our Parish need to contact the **Parish Office on 9580 7981**. (If you live outside the Parish we recommend that you contact the Parish you are currently living in as this is the Parish your child will grow up and become involved in)

Baptisms are celebrated in our Parish on set dates each month in either a Baptismal Service or during a Parish Mass.

Our parish Baptismal Programme is comprised of: -

- 1. Adult Preparation Meeting
- 2. Welcoming Eucharist (2 weeks prior to Baptism)
- 3. Sacrament of Baptism

The Parish charges an administration fee of \$20 which covers the cost of the Baptism Preparation. Additional costs include the purchase of a Baptismal Candle and Stole. Our Parish is able to provide these at a very reasonable price if you wish. Families are also encouraged to make a thanksgiving donation to Fr Andrew on the day of your baptism.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Adults wishing to become Catholic can do so through our RCIA Program which starts each year in September and ends with Baptisms at Easter the following year. For more information contact the **Parish Office on 9580 7981**

Catechist Program

Our Parish Catechist Program offers Religious Instruction Classes for children not attending Catholic Schools. The classes teach the children about our Faith and help prepare them for the Sacraments.

Classes are held on Tuesday afternoons from 4pm to 5pm at St Louis de Montfort's Church. They run from February to November.

Our Parish Logo:

The St Mary of the Cross Catholic Parish logo consists of four significant elements that assist in identifying the newly merged parish.



St Mary of the Cross Catholic Parish

The **green circle** represents 'care of our common home', displaying a stylised cross within the negative space; the **blue wave** symbolises the bayside location, with the **overlapping shades** signifying the merging of the Parishes of St Louis de Montfort's, Aspendale and St Brigid's, Mordialloc. Finally, inclusion of the **Southern Cross** acknowledges St Mary of the Cross as the first Australian saint.

The new motto **`Embodying Christ's Love'**, emanates from the parish vision statement. The verb 'Embodying' is seen as an action word for a vibrant parish community impelled by Christ's love in all that they do.

Our Parish logo was designed by the Fraynework Agency who are part of the wider Mercy family.

HISTORY OF THE PARISH

Aspendale and Mordialloc Parishes were originally part of the Parish of St Patrick's, Mentone. They became the Parish of St Brigid's, Mordialloc in 1949. Then in 1970 Aspendale became the Parish of St Louis de Montfort's, Aspendale.

St Brigid's & St Louis became a combined Parish in 1999. As partnered Parishes while they still have their own identities they share a Parish Priest and so they also share many of their services and groups.

Our two Parishes amalgamated in 2019 and became the Parish of St Mary of the Cross, Mordialloc & Aspendale.

The Parish Priest lives in the Presbytery (next to St Brigid's Church) at 520 Main St, Mordialloc.

The Parish Office is part of the Parish & School Complex at St Louis de Montfort's, 37 Dolphin St, Aspendale.


Your opportunity to get involved



Justice Action Group:

The Justice Action Group (JAG) meets on the **second Wednesday of each month at 7.30pm at St Louis' Church.**

The group focuses on many social justice issues both local and global issues. The Meetings involve discussion and education of the members of the Group which extends to the wider Parish Community through Guest Speaker Nights or simply information being made available through our Parish publications.



Some members are involved in actions related to social justice issues and these activities are reported on at the JAG Meetings.



The Justice Action Group (JAG) encourages supporters of their activities to make donations at any time via a Donation Jar (the JAG Jar) which is left in the Church Foyer. The donated funds are used to help fund JAG's Projects, arrange Guest Speaker Nights, support JAG's work with asylum seekers and other social issues.

Our Parish Saints: St Mary of the Cross

Mary MacKillop was born in Fitzroy in 1842. Her parents, Flora and Alexander MacKillop, were Catholic immigrants from Scotland. Mary was the eldest of eight children and at 16 she went out to work to support her younger brothers and sisters. Two years later she took a job as a governess on her uncle's farm in the small country town of Penola in South Australia. Here Mary met Father Julian Tenison Woods and together they opened the first free Catholic School. A year later they founded a new order of religious nuns - the Sisters of St Joseph who were devoted to teaching the poor. As well as schools, Mary MacKillop and the sisters founded hospitals and orphanages, provided shelters for the homeless. former prostitutes and unmarried mothers. Mary died in North Sydney on 8th August



1909. She was beatified in 1995 and canonised in 2010. She is Australia's first saint and is known as St Mary of the Cross and her feast day is 8th August.

Our Parish Saints: St Brigid

St Brigid's Feast Day is on 1st Feb each year - the beginning of Spring in Ireland. St Brigid and St Patrick are the patron saints of Ireland. St Brigid is also the patron saint for babies, blacksmiths, cattle, chicken farmers, children whose parents are not married, dairy workers, fugitives, mariners, midwives, milkmaids, poets, scholars, travellers.

St Brigid was born in Ireland around 453, eight years before St Patrick's death and in a time when Ireland was embracing Christianity.

There are many versions of her life story and legends associated with St Brigid. It is believed she was born near Kildare. Her parents were a pagan chieftain and a Christian slave. She was named after an ancient Goddess

Brigid was known for her goodness and her generosity, giving much of what she had to the poor. She occasionally gave away some of her father's possessions and the produce from the dairy where her mother worked.

Although her parents would have preferred her to marry Brigid wanted to devote her life to God and the service of the poor. Legend says she asked God to take away her beauty so that she would not have to marry. Miraculously her beauty returned on the day she became a nun.

She began a religious community (the first in Ireland) initially with 7 companions in Ardagh then moving to Kildare. This community grew and she set up many others throughout Ireland. The Brigidine Sisters have St Brigid as their patron, so her influence continues today. Many people are inspired by Brigid's story, and admire her as one who championed women, justice and peace. She died in 525 and is buried in the same tomb as St Patrick. Just as the shamrock is associated with St Patrick, a cross made from rushes is the symbol of St Brigid. This is one of the most widespread Irish customs associated

with her.

Legend tells how she picked up rushes from the floor and began to weave them into a cross while she sat at the deathbed of a pagan chieftain. It was customary for dirt floors to be strewn with rushes both for warmth and cleanliness. When he


asked what she was doing, she told him about Jesus and his death on the cross. Before he died, the chieftain asked to be baptised.

Crosses are traditionally made from



rushes, but they can also be made from wheat stalks, grasses, or reeds. The crosses are typically made on the eve of St Brigid's Day and placed above the door of the house for blessing and protection. There are many examples of St Brigid's Cross used to decorate our Church at Mordialloc. Also, one of the beautiful stained-glass windows is devoted to St Brigid and includes many of the symbols associated with her.

Our Parish Saints: St Louis de Montfort



Louis-Marie Grignion was born in Montfort in France on 31st January 1673.

He was the eldest surviving child of the large family of Jean-Baptiste Grignion and Jeanne Robert. He grew up in Iffendic (near Montfort) where his father had bought a farm. He went to the Jesuit College of St Thomas Becket in Rennes from the age of 12 and after finishing his schooling he went on to study philosophy and theology there. He was then given the opportunity, benefactor, to through а study theology at the Sorbonne in Paris. He travelled to Paris on foot and on the way gave away all his money to the poor and vowed to live only on alms and become a champion of the poor. While studying he lodged in а succession of boarding houses among

the very poor and after two years became very ill and was hospitalized. On his release from hospital Louis was given a place at Saint Sulpice, a French School of Spirituality. It was here that he began to focus his study on the Virgin Mary's place in Christian life and this later lead to his devotion to the Holy Rosary and his many acclaimed books on Mary and the Rosary.

He was ordained in 1700. He was a gifted orator and preached the Rosary and formed Rosary confraternities.

After a pilgrimage to Rome to see Pope Clement XI he was appointed an Apostolic Missionary and preached for several years in missions throughout France, travelling from town to town on foot. He became known as the 'good father from Montfort"

He wrote several books including:

"True devotion to Mary"

"Secret of Mary"

"Secret of the Rosary"

He also wrote many poems and hymns. Louis established free schools for poor children. He helped found the "Daughters of Wisdom" – who devoted themselves to work in hospitals and also the instruction of poor girls and the "Company of Mary" –a missionary group. He died as a result of illness on 28th April 1716. Thousands attended his burial in the Parish Church at Saint-Laurent-sur-Sèvre and there were stories of miracles performed at his tomb. He was beatified in 1888 by Pope Leo XIIIand canonized in 1947 by Pope Pius XII.
