GOSPEL REFLECTION

The characters in the parable told in today's Gospel illustrate two radically different ways of coming before God. In prayer the focus should be upon God. The Pharisee's concern, however, is all about himself. Worse still, it also includes the failings of his fellow human being, so conveniently illustrated here in the person of the tax-collector.

The Pharisee (though, of course, not all Pharisees were like this) typifies those who can only bolster their own self-image by putting others down. Life is a competition in virtue. God's role is that of assessing the results and issuing the prizes. Prayer is an opportunity to keep God informed about how successfully one is doing, and also about the shortcomings of others.

The tax-collector, by contrast, simply pleads that God be merciful to him, a sinner. In what sense was he sinner? Because of personal moral failure? Perhaps. But perhaps also because, with a family to support and no other job possibilities, he finds himself trapped in an occupation that makes him a sinner in his own eyes and those of his world. All this the parable leaves open.

In any case, as declared by Jesus, it is the tax collector who is right with God ("justified"), while the Pharisee is not.

This should bring comfort to many who feel trapped in their sinfulness and unworthy to approach God. The parable suggests that God can deal far more easily with our sinfulness than our "righteousness" in our own eyes. It is the latter that erects a barrier against the bountiful mercy of God.

Here is what one participant had to say about this experience:

Dear Fr Jude and MSSP Lay Community Team,

Thank you very much for the opportunity last weekend [Sat 12 Oct] to be able to participate in the Reflection Day.

There were many aspects that gave me an affirmation of where I'm at and what I need to do to keep going with my life journey, socially and spiritually. I think this connects to what was said by Joan Jennings about Joseph De Piro's mission. At times I feel at a crossroads and not sure which way to turn. I am energised by the fact that the followers of De Piro were able to find their way to carry out the plan laid out for them by God through the charism of Joseph De Piro, even though he died suddenly and only a short time after starting the missionary order. Here we are, over 100 years later, being guided by people who are also members of that order, MSSP, started by De Piro.

The actions of contemplation and then action are very pertinent for me. How often have I jumped into action without seeing what would follow after the action, then found I was still floundering? The contemplation session on the reflection day was a beautiful time to have. When I first heard it would be 30-40 minutes, I thought I would go crazy with thinking about "all the things I could be doing", but in fact, the time passed very quickly and I felt like I "achieved a lot". I spent a considerable part of that time observing a butterfly that landed on a plant near me. I would never have seen the beauty of that creature if I had just been walking past to attend another task. Later in the day, Joan talked about noticing the everyday signs of God's creation around us, such as the water as she drove past, and not taking it for granted. That is exactly what I felt with my butterfly.

I also felt inspired by other people in the group, The stories from the people in the small group session were very easy to relate to and built a connection between us. I think the community building between the people of the different parishes (and even from the same parish but different Mass time attendees, so not known to me) is enthusing and life giving. This is evidence for me to be reassured that the Church is very much alive and flourishing.

I found the day to be spirit filled and with a strong life-giving vibe. Several days later, I can still feel a smile come to my face when I think about the day. What a great way to acknowledge the month of Mission!
