- 1. STM Church Closed during Stage 3 restrictions

- 4. **Anointing of the Sick, and Communion for the housebound:** Anointing of the Sick is available only to the seriously ill. The Eucharist is given as Viaticum to the dying only.
- 5. Spiritual Guidance: Fr Joe is available from Tuesday to Sunday afternoon by phone only.
- 6. If you are elderly/living alone and need assistance with shopping—please call Fr Joe at the Parish Office.
- 7. Seasons: Please contact the parish office if you would like to receive a copy of Seasons by post.
- 8. Mass in private (without the congregation): Tuesday—Sunday

<u>Homily</u>

In the readings for this Sunday we hear that God is kind and lenient in his dealing with us, and his Spirit prays on our behalf whenever we cannot choose the right word in order to pray properly. Let us give thanks to God for his kindness to us.

Prayer is an important part of our life. It keeps us connected to God who is the source and meaning of our life. However, sometimes we may find that it is not easy to pray. We plan to put aside the time for God and yet cannot articulate or express in words the concerns that we want to bring to God in prayer. This can make prayer very distasteful and dry. We ought to remember that prayer is not about words or colourful words, it is ultimately about a personal encounter with God. Prayer is the platform where we meet God and can be still in his loving presence. St Paul says so beautifully in the second reading, "God who knows everything in our hearts knows perfectly well what (we) mean". In one sense, words are not all that important when we come to pray. God reads our heart and he knows our deepest desires. Therefore, we must not be worrying about not knowing the right choice of word to use. St Paul says, "for when we cannot choose words in order to pray properly, the Spirit himself expresses our plea in a way that could never be put into words..." Let us not give up praying even when it is difficult.

When we take our attention back to the first reading we learn from the book of Wisdom that our God is a God who cares for everything and he is lenient and merciful in his dealings with us. We are called to imitate God's patience and leniency in our dealing with others. The sad reality is that sometimes we can be very unkind and judgmental of our own fellow human beings. This part of us is in need of weed-ing if we want to follow more faithfully in the footsteps of Christ.

In the Gospel we hear that the Church, and indeed the world, is like a field in which wheat and weeds grow side by side until they are separated at the harvest time. However, <u>it is God's job to separate the wheat from the weeds – not ours</u>. Our task is to live peacefully with all people and practice leniency in our interaction with them. The Church too needs to be lenient in her dealing with the members of her flock. There will be great unhappiness for everyone whenever the Church or the individual want to usurp the power of God!

May we persevere in our prayer life and may we learn to be lenient with others as God is to us.

The 5 Finger Prayer

Thumb: Those closest to you, your family.

<u>Pointer</u>: Those that point you in the right direction (teachers, doctors, priests) ask for wisdom & support.

<u>Index:</u> (tallest) Those that lead us, (Government) ask for guidance & wisdom.

Ring: (weakest) Those

that are weak, in trouble, or in pain. We cannot pray too much for them.

<u>Pinkie:</u> (smallest) Our prayers for ourselves & our own needs.
