Returning to Stage 3 restrictions

In returning to Stage 3 restrictions, sadly, **STM** Church will need to be closed again to Mass and private prayer; and the numbers allowed for funerals and weddings will be severely limited.

<u>Baptisms</u> in a restricted zone are to be postponed, unless there is an urgent and grave pastoral need. (Can. 857; 860).

<u>Funerals</u> held in a restricted zone <u>will be limited to 10 people plus those required to conduct the funeral.</u>

Wedding s will be limited to five people, including the celebrant.

Except for the exemptions noted regarding Weddings and Funerals, all public Masses, Liturgies and communal devotions (whether indoors or outdoors) <u>are temporarily suspended until 19 August</u> 2020, or until further notice.

Pastoral Care for STM Parish during the time of the Coronavirus Pandemic

This plan will be revised upon further easing of restrictions

- 1. STM Church Closed during Stage 3 restrictions
- 2. **Seasons** publish online, send out by email, or by post.
- 3. **Pastoral visitation**: Not available during Stage 3 restrictions
- 4. **Anointing of the Sick, and Communion for the housebound:** Anointing of the Sick is available only to the seriously ill. The Eucharist is given as Viaticum to the dying only.
- 5. Spiritual Guidance: Fr Joe is available from Tuesday to Sunday afternoon —by phone only.
- 6. **If you are elderly/living alone** and need assistance with shopping—please call Fr Joe at the Parish Office.
- 7. **Seasons:** Please contact the parish office if you would like to receive a copy of Seasons by post.
- 8. Mass in private (without the congregation): Tuesday—Sunday



Homily

People will always be looking for the thing that makes them completely happy. Wisdom helps people to realise that a close relationship with God is the greatest treasure they can discover in life. Do we believe this?

I have a special admiration for the young King Solomon. I am drawn to Solomon's honesty, transparency and humility. In the first reading we hear Solomon says to God, "I am a very young man, unskilled in leadership. Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil [so that I may care effectively for your people]". Solomon is not afraid to expose his vulnerability to God and speaks from his heart. (When was the last time that we engaged in a heart to heart conversation with God?). When the opportunity comes for Solomon to ask God for a gift, he only asks for a discerning heart. Solomon could have asked God for a diversity of things: more power, more strength, more wealth, or even more women. Solomon only yearns for the gift that will be most helpful to him in leading and caring for the people of God! And so, God gives to Solomon the wisest heart (wisdom). We can all learn from Solomon – his genuine desire to serve and to be a wise leader. We too are leaders. God has entrusted to us the responsibility to guide and care for some specific people (our family, students, members of the sporting clubs, patients and so on). Like Solomon, we too ought to ask God for the gift of wisdom so that we may carry out our duty faithfully.

Wisdom and knowledge are not one and the same thing. Through hard work and by attending school, university, training etc. I can obtain and develop knowledge in some particular fields. However, wisdom cannot be obtained through hard work alone. It is a special gift from God. God does not give to us all the wisdom that we required all at once, but gradually. As Fr Flor Mc Carthy sdb says, "wisdom comes to us like dew – it comes to us in tiny droplets without knowing it....... Wisdom is about knowing what is truly important in life. It is about seeing life from God's point of view and being able to live the way God wants us to live. Therefore, all of us need to pray fervently to God for this special gift of wisdom.

In bygone days people searched in fields, hills, mountains and seas for treasures such as gold, diamond and even ivory. Today, people are still searching for treasures. However, in this modern time the treasures people look for are not limited to precious things like gold or diamond, but they also include happiness, success and satisfaction. Sometimes people get so caught up with treasures hunting that they forget about their duties towards their loved ones – spouse, children and even parents. We may want to keep on searching for treasures, but wisdom tells us that the only true treasure we ought to be looking for is a warm relationship with God. Dear friends, when we find God – we find all. God knows the hunger, thirst and longing of our life better than we know them ourselves. God will give to us all that we need – he will satisfy our hungry heart.

May we be not afraid to turn to God in the time of needs and let us pray that he will give to us a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil.
