Stage 4 of Covid 19 Restrictions!!!

Parish Office Staff

<u>Parish offices must be closed.</u> Parish employees must work from home.

In the event of an urgent matter or certain extenuating circumstances and a parish employee needs to attend the parish office (or Church), the following steps must be followed:

- 1) the staff member must obtain an approved *work permit* before attending the parish office (the template for this *work permit* should be available on the Victorian Government website shortly; as soon as it is posted we will send a link)
- 2) the work permit must be carried with the staff member as proof if questioned by Police;
- 3)the staff member must stay at the parish office (or Church) the shortest possible period before returning home;
- 4) when attending the parish office (or Church), a written record of the staff member's time of arrival and departure must be kept;
- 5) while in the parish office (or Church), the staff member must wear a face mask at all times, practice social distancing and appropriate hand hygiene; and
- 6)directly after leaving the parish office (or Church), the staff member must wash/sanitise their hands.

Parish Volunteers

The health and safety of parish volunteers is also very important at this time. This means volunteers should not be attending Parish facilities and working from home if at all possible. If volunteers are engaged in essential services (e.g. preparation of food packs for the needy) then the necessary conditions apply:

- 1) the work permit must be carried with the volunteer as proof if questioned by Police;
- 2) the volunteer must complete the voluntary activity in the shortest possible period before returning home;
- 3) when volunteering, a written record of the volunteer's time of arrival and departure must be kept as well as a description of the activity;
- 4) whilst volunteering, the volunteer must wear a face mask at all times, practice social distancing and appropriate hand hygiene; and
- 5) immediately after completing the activity, the volunteer must wash/ sanitise their hands.

<u>Baptisms</u> in a restricted zone are to be postponed, unless there is an urgent and grave pastoral need. (Can. 857; 860).

<u>Funerals</u> held in a restricted zone <u>will be limited to 10 people plus those required to conduct the funeral.</u>

Weddng s are banned during Stage 4 of Covid 19 Restrictions

Except for the exemptions noted regarding Weddings and Funerals, all public Masses, Liturgies and communal devotions (whether indoors or outdoors) are temporarily suspended until further notice.



Homily

The lord is always near, even when we can't see him or feel his presence. He is with us during the moments of silence as well as the times of tribulation. Jesus always comes to us and with his presence calms our fears and brings us peace. All we are required to do is to keep focusing on the Lord!

Be not afraid of the sacred silence! Some people feel uncomfortable and lonely when there is too much silence in their life. But, God is with us in the silence. When our heart is still and quiet we can more easily hear the gentle voice of Jesus whispering to us. Silence is the moment of grace – when we encounter God and hear his tender voice. As we learn from the first reading, the way of God is the way of gentleness and calmness.

God is also present with us during the time of tribulation. As we read in the Gospel, the apostles get into the boat to go on ahead of Jesus to the other side of the lake. Unfortunately, in the middle of the night, there is a change in the weather and the apostles encounter the turbulent sea. We can imagine the fear and anxiety that the apostles must have felt when their boat is hit with a violent head wind. But, just at this moment when the apostles are experiencing extreme anguish and fear, Jesus comes to them and says "Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid!" Jesus is always near us and with us even when the situation is most threatening. There is nothing that can separate us from Jesus. When we are most in need or danger Jesus will come to calm our fear and to give us peace.

Our world is battling with the most contagious virus – Covid 19. This pandemic has taken so much peace out of many people – the old and young alike. Many of us are afraid. Some of us cannot understand how God can possibly allowed such a virus to cause so much fear, pain and sorrow for the whole world. But, even in the midst of fear and confusion, let us hear Jesus says to us "Do not be afraid!....[I am here with you - to give you healing and peace]".

In the experience of the disciples and Peter we find reflected the experience of every Christian. Peter who is full of enthusiasm and courage makes the attempt to walk on the water towards Jesus. Everything goes well as long as Peter continues to keep his eyes on Jesus. But, when Peter allows himself to be so distracted by the wind and storm that he takes his eyes away from Jesus, he begins to drown. What does Jesus do? Jesus puts out his hand at once and takes Peter to safety. We may choose to take our gaze away from Jesus, but he will never abandon us. Similar to the apostles we too begin our Christian journey with enthusiasm, hope and joy. And also like the apostles, our faith dwindles when the wind and wave of frustration disappointment assail us. However, may we never turn our eyes away from the Lord, and may we continue to trust that he is always near to support regardless of the waves of trouble that engulf us.

This weekend let us pray that we will have the grace to keep focusing on Jesus no matter how many challenges we encounter in life. Let us trust that Jesus always comes to us and with his presence calms our fears and brings us peace.
