As of 25th November, the Guidelines state:

Places of Worship may have indoor religious ceremonies for a total of 150 people plus 1 celebrant .

Our St Thomas More Church has a total capacity (based on current distancing laws) of 65 people.

DHHS has given the following directives for gathering of **all** religious groups:

- ❖ Social distancing is to be observed at all times. ❖ Hand sanitising is to be observed at all times.
- ❖ Wearing of a face-mask is mandatory. ❖ Absolutely No physical contact between persons.



A Special Message from Fr Joe

Dear friends,

There have been several changes to the appointment of the clergy in the Archdiocese over the last few months. There has also been a change to my appointment. **Archbishop Peter Comensoli has appointed me as Chaplain to the Royal Melbourne Hospital and Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre, and part-time assistant priest to the parish of St Michael's, North Melbourne.** Some of you may know that one of my passions is to walk with people during their time of illness and suffering. The appointment as hospital chaplain is something that I have been waiting for in the last several years – finally, the opportunity has come.

The appointments as hospital chaplain and part-time assistant priest come into effect on 16 Dec 2020. **Therefore, my last day at STM parish is 15 December 2020.**

I have been at STM parish for 15 months, and I really enjoy being part of this beautiful parish. I will miss STM Parish very much. Thank you for your hospitality and kindness to me throughout the past 15 months. May the Lord continue to bless you in your good work.

What's Happening Here ...

Asylum Seekers and Refugees in Australia's Care

We currently have a significant number of refugees and asylum seekers in our care both within continental Australia and on Nauru, Christmas Island and Papua New Guinea. It has always been legal to seek asylum in Australia and we have human and legal responsibilities for refugees and asylum seekers in our care. The Brigidine Asylum Seekers Project (BASP) is one important Catholic group that assists in practical ways, those within our own local communities, who need a chance to live a decent life, free from fear of death, persecution and torture. Refugees and asylum seekers need the chance to make a new home, where they are safe and can live in some dignity and hope. Here is one practical way to help people in Community Detention in Australia. Hand write a letter to a politician. All the details, from BASP are provided in two documents below: the first document explains how to write a letter and why it is important for us to act; the second provides all the necessary contact details of politicians who make important decisions affecting refugees and asylum seekers.

The [16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence](#) is an annual international campaign that kicks off on 25 November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, and runs until 10 December, Human Rights Day.

A Webinar will be conducted on December 10, at 1.00 pm which will take the form of a prayer prepared by ACRATH members, including two from our parish, and will have a focus on violence against women and girls as well as picking up on the themes of Advent and UN Rights.

SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE

SHAC (Seaford Housing Action Coalition)

SHAC began in 2014 as an initiative of St Anne's parish Seaford, Seaford Community Committee, residents of Seaford Beach Cabin Park and our parish's St Vincent de Paul conference. It doesn't limit itself to Seaford, but covers neighbouring suburbs, as social problems can't be contained to one postcode.

In brief, it sees itself as working with those at risk of homelessness, identifying needs and working with them towards achievable solutions. To this end, it liaises with government, and community and private accommodation providers to help support people obtain affordable, secure and appropriate housing.

Most recently, SHAC presented a submission to the Legislative Council inquiry into homelessness and canvassed support on accommodation issues from candidates for local government elections. It is pressing for the development of social and emergency housing on currently available Crown land, and the purchase off appropriate properties.

It is politically non-partisan, which allows easier access to some local, state and federal politicians, as well as having open communication channels with local government officials. There is no requirement of religious affiliation. Membership is free and anyone is welcome to attend meetings, held monthly (by Zoom, in the current health crisis). Membership, apart from the organisations which established the group, is fluid, with special interest groups "dropping in" for a few meetings then disappearing, but always contributing or borrowing ideas.

People who are homeless, in insecure, unaffordable or unsafe housing, or in danger of being so, affect our whole community, not just our immediate neighbourhood. Accommodation insecurity can lead to drug and alcohol problems, property crimes, abusive relationships, domestic breakdowns and mental ill-health. No responsible society can afford to have these difficulties; even more so, we, as followers of Christ, can't just look at this as society's problem. Jesus will hold us accountable for what we did or didn't do to help our neighbour.


