Dear Friends,

It was a great honor to celebrate the Masses over the weekend and to meet so many of you. I also had the opportunity to sit down with a number of parishioners at the Vinnies Lunch and got to know some of you a little better. I thought I would take this opportunity to introduce myself to you a little more.

I grew up in New Plymouth, New Zealand where my parents were farmers. I'm the youngest of six children, all my siblings and immediate family still live in New Zealand. A formative moment growing up was when we relocated to live in the workers cottage at a Cistercian Monastery called Southern Star



Abbey, where my parents managed the 1200 acre dairy farm. Our family often hosted the monks for meals and coffees, as well as many couples, singles and other families who came to make retreats at the monastery. Though I did not realise it at the time, these happy years being immersed in the lively community of faith, prayer, work and visitors turned out to be the first seeds sown of my own Priestly vocation.

A further turning point in my life was attending World Youth Day in Toronto, 2002. Here I began to see as a young man my place in the wider Church. I was encouraged to meet other youth who took their faith seriously. I returned to Canada in 2004 to attend a one-year discipleship college where fifty young men and women lived in community for 10 months before a 6 week mission outreach, in my case hosting retreats in schools in parishes all around the province of Saskatchewan. I came back to New Zealand and finished my Bachelor of Accounting, and after looking for full time work in Wellington, I moved to Melbourne in 2006. In 2007 I began working as an Investment and Tax accountant at National Australia Bank. I was working through the process of becoming a fully qualified Chartered Accountant.

While this work was interesting and my future career promising, I found myself thinking more and more about the Priesthood. After a series of unlikely coincidences and some serious discernment, I felt I had no choice (!) but to enter Corpus Christi Seminary in February 2009. I was ordained a Priest with six others on September 12th, 2015. Since entering the seminary I have spent time in parishes all around the Archdiocese: St Albans, Mordialloc/Aspendale, Bacchus Marsh/Melton, Clayton & Mount Waverley.

In the breviary there is a psalm which reads "the lot marked out for me is my delight". It's a line which has given consolation and encouragement to the Israelites over many centuries, as it has for me. I take it to mean that those who follow God never really know where he will ask them to go, or for how long, or what they might be asked to do. At times God asks us to do things that seem difficult or impossible. It means thought, that we Christians find ourselves on a great adventure and are invited to trust in God's providence and not in our own strength. It is a great privilege and honor to be a Catholic Priest and to be given responsibility for the souls at St More Parish. Let us pray together for God's continued blessings on our parish and for his blessings on each one of us.
