Dear Friends,

As we begin the month of March we have welcomed a number of families who are preparing to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Reconciliation at St Thomas More. It is heartening that after the disruption of COVID last year there remains a great interest for children to receive the grace of the Sacraments and to be immersed in the Parish Community. Let us keep them all in our prayers over the next few months.



You will have noticed that from this week onward weekday Masses are scheduled every day from Tuesdays to Fridays. This will continue throughout the year. The Tuesday evening Mass at 7:00PM will make weekday Mass available to workers, and for the children in our Sacramental programme who will join the Parish community for Mass during school term. After the 9:15 Mass on Wednesday there will be Stations of the Cross celebrated during Lent; all are welcome to join. On Fridays after Mass we have the Easter Scripture DVD Series the Parish Community Centre. As we continue to spiritually prepare ourselves for the coming feasts at Easter, let us make good use of the opportunities available to us at work, at home and in the parish.

Reflection:

Today's gospel passage foreshadows the death of Jesus. As a devout Jew, Jesus goes up to Jerusalem at Passover. His final going-up will be the occasion of his death and resurrection. The Jerusalem Temple, Judaism's most holy place, is the site of a dramatic incident, an event that is recounted in all four gospels. The Synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke) locate it towards the end of the gospel. They present it as a catalyst for the intensification of hostility between the temple authorities and Jesus. John's gospel, in contrast, places it at the beginning of Jesus' ministry.

The tension between Jesus and the temple authorities that is to culminate in his death in all four gospels is thus present from the outset in John. Jesus acts decisively, even violently, to draw attention to the primary function of God's house. He creates an effective weapon, a whip of cords, and comprehensively clears the temple precinct of merchants, sheep, and cattle. He overturns the tables of the money-changers, orders the dovesellers out and tells them all, in words that evoke the prophecy of Zechariah (14:21), to stop making God's house "a market-place". Zechariah had declared that, in the end times, there would no longer be traders in God's house. There was legitimate commercial activity associated with temple worship, such as the purchase of animals and doves for sacrifice, a practice we might now critique, and the conversion of money to pay the Temple tax.

The traders seem to have forgotten that this activity was a means to an end and not an end in itself. In John's account, the disciples partially understand: they interpret Jesus' actions in the light of Psalm 69:9: "It is zeal for your house that has consumed me". "The Jews" request a "sign ... for doing this". In other words, they ask Jesus to demonstrate the source of his authority for his actions. His response is a challenge: "Destroy this temple, and in three days, I will raise it up". "The Jews" misunderstand. This provides Jesus with the opportunity to play on the word "temple": the temple is not only a material edifice that took forty-six years to build. It is also, metaphorically, his body that will be destroyed and raised up "in three days". The narrator provides the explanation and indicates that the disciples will eventually understand and come to belief. It is important to note that John writes with the wisdom of hindsight. As we travel the journey to Jerusalem this Lent, we are invited to remember that God, and not the opponents of Jesus, will have the final word in this drama.

Slavery-Free Easter



The sweet,

truth about
Easter Chocolate

Excerpts from the Message of Pope Francis for Lent 2021

During this season of conversion, let us renew our faith, draw from the "living water" of hope, and receive with open hearts the love of God, who makes us brothers and sisters in Christ.

The path of poverty and self-denial (**fasting**), concern and loving care for the poor (**almsgiving**), and childlike dialogue with the Father (**prayer**) make it possible for us to live lives of sincere faith, living hope and effective charity.

One way to show concern and loving care for the poor (almsgiving - healing) is to take action on practices that exploit the poor.

The ACRATH Slavery Free Easter campaign is one form of action. Some of the chocolate we enjoy at Easter is tainted by slavery and comes at the cost of a child's health, education and sometimes his or her freedom. Much of our chocolate is made using cocoa beans harvested by children, often in the West African region. Many of these children are forced into labour. We can help change this by buying slavery free chocolate

Where to buy chocolate that is certified slavery-free?

Slavery-free chocolate is chocolate that is certified. Look for chocolate with one of the four logos (below) on it – Fairtrade, UTZ or Rainforest Alliance.

There are some slavery-free chocolates available in most large supermarkets and ALDI and Haighs have an extensive range of UTZ certified chocolates and even more leading up to Easter.

Fairtrade Australia and New Zealand has a list of slavery-free certified chocolates.
