Reflection:

Many of the readings from Mark's Gospel that we have encountered over past weeks focus on the misunderstanding the disciples have about the nature of the kingdom that Jesus proclaims. They remain locked into an earthly understanding of political power. In this text from John, Jesus makes very explicit that this is not the case. His kingdom is not of this world! Pilate pushes the point in order to trap him into an admission of guilt: 'So you are a king then?' Jesus' kingship, however, is not to be bound by earthly understandings. He is indeed a king, but he exercises his kingship by making known the love of God. For this purpose alone he came into the world: to bear witness to the truth that 'God so loved the world that he gave his only son' (John 3:16). It is for the world and all humanity that Christ died, so we should avoid the mistake of thinking that Christ's kingdom is in some way unreal or anchored in the clouds. While it is not of this world, it is most definitely anchored in this world. All Christians are challenged to help bring this kingdom to fulfillment here and now. 'Thy kingdom come, on earth as it is in heaven.' It is in the lives and hearts of ordinary people and the societies they build that Christ's kingdom lives and awaits completion. We too must bear witness to this truth.

The feast of Christ the King is a relatively new one in the church calendar. It was established in 1925 by Pope Pius XI after the world had experienced the horrors of World War I and been shocked at the brutality and destruction of that conflict between so-called civilised and Christian nations. The role of the Church in social and cultural life was diminishing, and there was greater separation of church and state. This feast sought to confront growing secularism head on. Since Vatican II, the Church has seen itself in a new dialogue with the world, and this feast now more strongly reflects upon the nature of Christ's kingship.

Dear Fathers and Lay Leaders,

With the season of Advent soon upon us, we wanted to reflect a little on our journeying together in the *Take the Way of the Gospel* process and, most importantly, thank you for your continuing involvement in this important work.

Whilst COVID restrictions have made things difficult, back in April and May we were able to gather in person with our clergy and lay leaders to effectively "launch" the *Take the Way of the Gospel* initiative. Echoing the missionary call of Pope Francis, Archbishop Peter spoke of the fundamental need to strengthen and re-invigorate parish life. Archbishop Peter also outlined the three-fold aim of *Take the Way of the Gospel*:

- 1. to more effectively share the Gospel of the Lord
- 2. to ensure our local faith communities are places of vibrancy, vitality and viability
- 3. to fairly share ministerial and other resources for pastoral co-operation and the building up of the whole Body of Christ across the Archdiocese.

At Pentecost, Archbishop Peter wrote to the whole Archdiocese encouraging people to begin *Take the Way of the Gospel* with prayer. In June, prayer resources were developed and people from over 50 parishes gathered online over a series of sessions to reflect on the Archbishop's letter and pray for our Archdiocese as we begin a new journey together.

In August and September, close to 550 clergy and lay leaders attended 9 online regional meetings. Whilst online is a poor substitute for face to face gatherings, nonetheless the meetings were an important opportunity to share the Location IQ social and demographic analysis and to outline a more local process of discernment and consideration. In a particular way, parishes were invited to overlay the Location IQ work with their own, more direct and intimate understanding of local factors, and begin to explore opportunities for collaboration and partnership with adjacent parish and faith communities.

In September and October, 400 people attended further follow-up sessions to ask questions, seek further clarification and explore resources that have been developed to assist parishes as they begin to discern their way forward.

As a result of these discussions, and following considerable prayer, a number of parishes have entered into a more structured process of spiritual and practical conversations to explore new models of parish collaboration and partnership.

A Parish Resources Pack has been developed to assist parishes ready to embark on these conversations.

The Archdiocese is committed to the safety, wellbeing and human dignity of children, young people and adults.

It is important, as our churches begin to reopen, that our parishes once again become welcoming homes and a source of hope for our people. After nearly 18 months of COVID, there is much to catch up on. Understandably then, not all parishes will want to move at the same pace in exploring *Take the Way of the Gospel*. Many parishes have made the decision to wait until next year to begin their in-person parish *Take the Way of the Gospel* listening and discernment sessions. For this reason, the Archbishop has recently announced that the process of prayer and discernment for parishes will be continuing throughout 2022. This allows flexibility for those parishes who would like to move more quickly as well as for those who need more time.

As we approach, the season of Advent, may we rejoice in the ability to gather once again in our parish communities as we prepare to celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation. May the Christ Child born to us at Christmas come into our hearts and be present to us in a special way this Christmas.
